THE SERIES

Virginia Union won the only previous meeting between the Panthers and Wildcats, a 13-0 decision in the 1953 Tropical Bowl. The game took place on Dec. 6, 1953 in Jacksonville, Fla., seeing the Panthers top a Bunky Matthews coached squad.

QUICK HITS

- Senior LB **Jarkevis Fields** and senior TE **Jordan Murphy** were each named MVPs of the John Merritt Classic in Nashville, Tenn. Fields was Defensive MVP, while Murphy earned the Offensive MVP award.

- OL **Alex Monroe** was named MEAC Offensive Lineman of the Week, while LB **Jarkevis Fields** collected Defensive Player of the Week accolades. Fields was also named as the Boxtorow National Player of the Week.

- The Wildcats last CIAA opponent was Shaw University in 2009, resulting in a 20-6 setback in Daytona Beach in the season-opener under former coach Alvin B. Wyatt, Sr.

- Despite the win over Tennessee State, B-CU fell two spots to No. 25 in this week's *The Sports Network* poll, while falling three spots to No. 23 in the FCS Coaches poll.

- The Wildcats remain the top Division I team in the Boxtorow poll.

- Jackson and SR DL **LeBrandon Richardson** are on the College Football Performance Award (CFPA) FCS National Player of the Year Trophy Watch List.

- Bethune-Cookman has scored 10 or more points in 19 straight games, the longest active streak in the MEAC of 10-plus points.

- The Wildcats have scored in double-figures in 35-of-36 games under head coach **Brian Jenkins**. The lone game without 10 or more points was a 22-3 setback at North Carolina A&T on Oct. 8, 2011.

1. First meeting between Virginia Union and Bethune-Cookman since 1953.
2. Since moving to Division I in 1980, Bethune-Cookman is 28-12-1 against teams from lower divisions (II, III, NAIA).
3. Isidore Jackson last 5 games:

4. Bethune-Cookman failed to accumulate 300 yards of total offense in a season-opener for the first time under Brian Jenkins last weekend at Tennessee State.
5. Bethune-Cookman has not allowed an offensive touchdown at home in the regular season since the second quarter of last year's game against NCCU (10/27/12).

SUNSHINE STATE OF MIND

- The Bethune-Cookman Wildcats will play eight of their 12 regular season games in the state of Florida.
- The Cats will play five of their final six games in the Sunshine State, including the annual *Florida Blue Florida Classic* against rival Florida A&M.

AGAINST THE #CIAA

- In home-openeres all-time against schools from the CIAA, Bethune-Cookman is 3-2.
- B-CU is 8-4 all-time against teams from the CIAA. In 1995 and 1996, the Cats dropped a pair of games to Norfolk State who was transitioning to Division I from the CIAA.

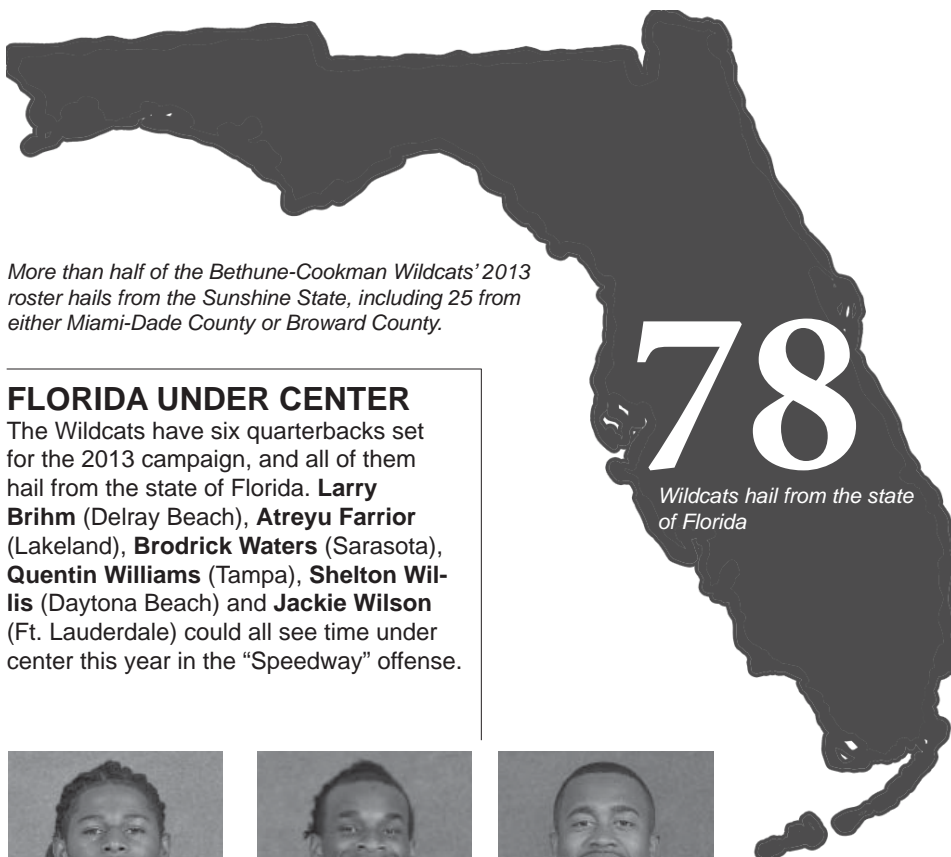

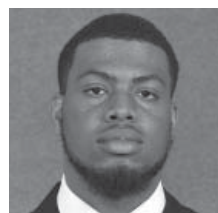

LET'S GET IT STARTED

- For the first time in school history a week ago at Tennessee State, Bethune-Cookman began a season ranked in the Coaches Poll Top 20.
- It also marked the first time in the Sports Network Top 25 era that the Wildcats began a campaign in the Top 25.

HOW ABOUT 'U'?

- The transfers from FBS schools just keep coming to head coach **Brian Jenkins** and his staff. Word is out about the style of play and the overall direction of the program, and that's keeping players flocking to Daytona Beach. At the present time, the Wildcats have three players from the University of Miami on the roster, including former starters at the "U" **JR CB Thomas Finnie** and **GRAD DE Dyrone Dye**.

A WIN OVER VIRGINIA UNION WOULD...

- Improve head coach **Brian Jenkins** to 3-1 all-time in home-openers.
- Give Bethune-Cookman its first-ever victory over Virginia Union.
- Improve the Wildcats' regular season winning streak to nine games.
- Improve **Brian Jenkins'** Bethune-Cookman record to 29-8 overall.
- Bump B-CU's all-time record against the CIAA to 9-3.
- Raise the Cats' home winning streak to four games.

#IKECANFIXIT

- Senior running back Isidore Jackson is heading up the walls of the B-CU record books at a fast pace. He enters the season needing just 393 yards to put himself atop the all-time list for career rushing yards in B-CU history. Additionally, he needs just three touchdowns to match Jimmie Russell (2004-07) at fourth place all-time for career rushing scores in school history.

JENKINS AT MUNICIPAL

- Head coach **Brian Jenkins** made his sideline debut at Municipal Stadium Sept. 4, 2010 (W, 70-10 vs. Edward Waters) after spending the prior season calling plays from the booth high above as Rutgers' offensive coordinator. Since Jenkins' arrival in 2010, the Wildcats are 14-4 at Municipal Stadium, averaging 40.6 points per game at home. Of the four losses at Municipal

THREE-HEADED MONSTER

- Every week on the MEAC Coaches Teleconference, **Brian Jenkins** is asked about who will start at quarterback. The answer has, and always will be, that the Wildcats have a "three-headed monster" behind center in the form of three capable signal callers. B-CU has SR **Brodrick Waters**, JR **Quentin Williams** and SR **Jackie Wilson** all with unique skills, and Jenkins has each of them ready to go at any given moment to take over the reigns of the offense in a contest.

STAY IN THE POLLS

- Despite falling two spots after a victory, Bethune-Cookman continues its string of appearances in the FCS top 25 this week, appearing at No. 25. Dating back to last year, this marks the fifth consecutive week the Cats have been ranked in either the *Sports Network* or Coaches poll.

NO THANKS, THE GROUND IS FINE

- The Bethune-Cookman offense is about as balanced as it can be, and there's no better way to show that under head coach **Brian Jenkins** than with the fact B-CU hasn't passed for 300 yards in a game since Nov. 20, 2010 vs. Florida A&M.
- None of the current Wildcat quarterbacks have accumulated a 300-yard game passing in their Maroon and Gold careers, but all are capable of producing big numbers on the ground.
- In the Jenkins' era, only twice have the Cats passed for 300-yards or more (vs. Delaware State - Oct. 9, 2010; vs. FAMU - Nov. 20, 2010).

I DON'T MEAN TO PRY, BUT...

- Offensive coordinator Jim Pry has several ties around the nation, not to mention with Vanderbilt. His son, Brent Pry, serves as Vanderbilt's Assistant Head Coach and Co-Defensive Coordinator. In addition, Franklin coached current Vandy head coach James Franklin while he was at East Stroudsburg in Pennsylvania.

HEAD COACH BRIAN JENKINS

- In three short seasons, **Brian Jenkins** has threatened to redefine the 90-year history of football at Bethune-Cookman University. It started in 2010 in his first year as the Wildcats' head coach, coming from Rutgers as an assistant coach. Throughout the duration has been an emergence of a program among the nation's elite behind the architect of one of the most prolific offenses in the entire Football Championship Subdivision. No other coach in school history has guided the football team to two Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) titles in his first three years. While Oliver "Buddy" Pough of South Carolina State has more league titles than that Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. native, only S.C. State's Bill Davis succeeded in doing so as a first-year coach. In the process of accumulating a 27-8 ledger in his three seasons at the helm, the two-time conference coach of the

year sandwiched a pair of FCS Playoff appearances around yet another winning season in 2011. Accentuating the success was last year's 21-16 Florida Blue Florida Classic win over rival Florida A&M, marking the first time B-CU collected consecutive wins against the Rattlers since 2003-04. In addition to accumulating a mark of 21-3 in league play, his .771 overall winning percentage is the second-highest in school history and his .875 percentage in conference play is the second-best by any third-year head coach in league annals.

CLOSE TO THE VEST

- **Brian Jenkins** has adopted the vest as his gameday attire, much like former Ohio State coach Jim Tressel. Though not a sweater vest, the Dri-Fit Russell vest with the B-CU football logo over top of a black, gold or maroon polo shirt is the signature gameday style for Jenkins.

RETURN MEN

- The 2013 Bethune-Cookman Wildcats return 50 letterwinners, including 13 players who were starters last season – six on offense and seven on defense. B-CU also welcomes back long snapper **Andrew Ferris**, after losing place kicker **Sven Hurd** and punter **Kory Kowalski**.

4-2 DEFENSE

- With the Bethune-Cookman offense compiling an average of 29.4 points per game a season ago, the Wildcats' defense took the opportunity by going deep on the depth chart in a number of games – especially the Savannah State contest, to get reserves ample snaps. The result was 42 different players registering at least one tackle on the year.

RETURN OF THE SPEEDWAY

- The 2013 edition of Bethune-Cookman University football looks to return to the 2010 form when speed was the talk of the team. This year's edition of Wildcats football features the return of the "Speedway" offense, as head coach **Brian Jenkins** and his staff look to turn up the pace in games with an explosive attack.

FIRST TIMERS

- The season-opener vs. Tennessee State will see a total of 40 players make their Bethune-Cookman debut, including 17 transfers either from junior college or FBS institutions. The 18 true freshman to take the field will be WR **Darian Baker**, QB **Larry Brihm**, WR **Frank Brown**, WR **Jawill Davis**, QB **Atreyu Farrior**, OL **Uriah Horne**, WR **Samuel Kelly**, OL **William Koen III**, WR **Ja-Quan Lumas**, OL **Dazzie Morris**, RB **Dre'Sean Nelson**, OL **Phillip Norman**, LB **Werley Placide**, RB **Nathaniel Pryor**, DL **DiShawn Ray**, RB **Jamaruz Thompkins**, WR **DeVonte Washington** and QB **Shelton Willis**.

HEALTHY JORDAN PAYING DIVIDENDS

- After his first injury-plagued season a year ago which kept him off the field, JR RB **Anthony Jordan** is seeking a healthy and happy year in 2013.
- Jordan stepped in nicely in his first game since 2011, carrying the ball eight times for 26 yards, averaging 3.2 per rush at Tennessee State.
- He came out of the backfield for two catches, averaging 4.0 YPC against the Tigers.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Bethune-Cookman has won six straight MEAC games on the road, which leads the league – Hampton and North Carolina A&T are second with just one. The Wildcats' last road loss occurred on Oct. 8, 2011, at North Carolina A&T (22-3) – the only conference setback in Brian Jenkins' three-year head coaching career.

LIGHTNING STRIKES

- Of Bethune-Cookman's 43 drives resulting in touchdowns last season, 25 lasted less than three minutes and 17 lasted two minutes or less. In fact, seven of B-CU's drives last 53 seconds or less.

RECORD BREAKERS

- The Wildcats' current roster features two players who have etched their names on a prestigious rushing list. SR RB **Isidore Jackson** is chasing several school records, including rushing yards and touchdowns. SR WR **Eddie Poole** chases the all-time receiving yards and receptions mark.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- Since 2010, Bethune-Cookman is 6-3 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State and Prairie View A&M in the MEAC/SWAC Challenge (2011, 2012). Two of the three losses have come against FBS opponent Miami (Fla.) out of the Atlantic Coast Conference. Thus, the lone non-conference loss for the Cats since 2010 came last season to Tennessee State in Daytona Beach, Fla. on the heels of a 21-14 setback.

BIG RUSHING ATTACK

- In 2012, Bethune-Cookman averaged 244 rushing yards per game, giving the Wildcats an average of 251.3 on the ground the last two seasons. That's the most in consecutive years since 2002-03.
- Both of B-CU's regular rotation running backs of **Isidore Jackson** (5.6) and **Rodney Scott** (4.5) averaged 4.5 yards or better per carry last season.

#FIELDS of DREAMS

- Senior linebacker Jarkevis Fields continues to apply pressure on opposing offenses with lightning speed and brute force. The Sanford, Fla. native collected a game-high matching 10 tackles last week against Tennessee State. For his efforts, he was selected as the John Merritt Classic Defensive MVP, as well as the MEAC Defensive Player of the Week.

FOUR-PUNCH COMBO

- Bethune-Cookman produced 39 touchdowns last season – running back Isidore Jackson (12), wide receiver Eddie Poole (5), quarterback Brodrick Waters (5) and fellow QB Quentin Williams (3) combined for 64 percent of them.



THE GRIND

- The original series The Grind, written and produced by The CatEye Network, made its debut last week with rave reviews. Check out BCUathletics.com for the latest show as well as previously archived shows.

SCHEDULE

- As usual, B-CU's 2013 schedule is challenging. Not only do the Wildcats face a pair of FCS opponents in FIU and Florida State, but another key non-conference match-up includes the season-opening visit to OVC foe Tennessee State. The TSU Tigers finished just outside the Top 25 polls a season ago, and were on the verge of claiming the first OVC crown in more than a decade. The contest against the Tigers will be played as part of the John Merritt Classic in the 63,000-seat L.P. Field – home of the TSU Tigers and Tennessee Titans of the National Football League. B-CU plays five home games at Municipal Stadium in 2013. The Cats welcome Virginia Union out of the CIAA, as well as MEAC contests against Savannah State, Norfolk State, South Carolina State (Homecoming) and Hampton. In fact, Bethune-Cookman will open the year with five of its first six games away from Daytona Beach, including a four-game stretch at FIU, FSU, Delaware State and Howard stretching into mid-October. As always, the



regular season slate concludes with the annual Florida Blue Florida Classic against rival Florida A&M at the Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Fla. B-CU's Homecoming game against S.C. State is one of the most anticipated Homecoming tickets in nearly a decade, and is expected to sell out in the coming weeks.

THEY'RE STAYING PUT

- For the first time in the **Brian Jenkins** era, the entire coaching staff from the 2012 campaign is back in place. This small facet is a big deal to Jenkins. For assistant coach **Terry Williams** and Chief of Operations **Jeff Fagan**, they have been with the program since the Alvin Wyatt years.

#30SOMETHING

- In each of its 9 wins a season ago, Bethune-Cookman has scored at least 20 points, including 5 wins when scoring 30+ points – all but one of those games coming in MEAC play.
- The Wildcats have won 19 straight games when scoring 30+ points and are 24-1 in their last 25 games.
- Bethune-Cookman's last loss when scoring 30+ in a game? Nov. 22, 2008 – a 58-35 loss against Florida A&M in Orlando, Fla.

POOLE KEEPS STREAKING

- Senior receiver **Eddie Poole** caught a pass in the first quarter against Tennessee State, continuing his consecutive games with a catch streak at 36 games, which stretches his entire career with the Wildcats after transferring from Rutgers.

TAKE YOUR PICK

- The Bethune-Cookman defense has registered an interception in 18 of the last 20 games. The Cats had the longest streak in the nation at 17 games prior to last season's *Florida Blue Florida Classic* against FAMU when they failed to collect an INT.

EXPLOSION PLAYS

- In 2012, Bethune-Cookman accumulated 47 "explosion plays" of 25 yards or more from scrimmage. Of that number, the Wildcats return 11 players in 2013 who accounted for 35 of those "big plays," including seven by SR RB **Isidore Jackson** and four from SR WR **Eddie Poole**. A staple of Bethune-Cookman's "Speedway" offensive attack, the Wildcats have averaged five "explosion plays" per game since the Miami game last season.

2013 BETHUNE-COOKMAN UNIFORM SYSTEM

- The Wildcats are taking the field this year wearing the MEAC's mandatory Russell apparel, but the combinations – including the helmets, will not be decided until game time each week by the players. The combinations last year had fans begging for more, and the combinations this year are sure to be just as exciting. Here's a breakdown of this combinations game-by-game:

FUN FACT I

- Bethune-Cookman's schedule this year includes three consecutive weeks in which the Wildcats will play a fellow "cat" opponent. Week One (Tigers); Week Two (Panthers); Week Three (Panthers).

FUN FACT II

- For the second year in a row, Bethune-Cookman will play six "State" opponents, and open with a "State" foe as well. B-CU holds a record of 21-9 all-time in season-openers versus "State" opponents. In fact, the Cats are 10-0 in those contests since 1992.

ON TV

- B-CU is one of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference's most televised teams annually, and this year proves to be no exception. The Wildcats have appeared in no less than three televised games each season since 2010, and this year's schedule will see five nationally broadcast games. Tennessee State, Florida State, North Carolina Central and Florida A&M will all be a part of the ESPN family of networks, while the FIU game is slated for a Fox Sports broadcast.

JACKSON, RICHARDSON NAMED TO CFPA WATCH LIST

- Senior running back **Isidore Jackson** and junior defensive lineman **LeBrandon Richardson** are among the names listed on the 2013 CFPA National Performer of the Year Watch List.
- Jackson and Richardson are two of seven FCS players from HBCUs on the 2013 National Performer of the Year Watch List by College Football Performance Award. The two players join Isaiah Crowell (Alabama State), Robert
