STORY LINES

- Bethune-Cookman comes into the contest with the nation's top-ranked defense against the run, allowing just 79.7 yards per game. In total defense, B-CU also ranks atop the FCS, allowing just 243.8 yards per game to the opposition.
- If Bethune-Cookman defeats Florida A&M, then it will mark the first time in history that the Wildcats have defeated the Rattlers four consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 MEAC contests, only three teams have amassed 100 yards rushing against the Bethune-Cookman defense — Hampton (161 — 2013, 173 — 2014) and Norfolk State (148) in 2013.
- The Wildcats have won four games this year when trailing entering the fourth quarter. In the Brian Jenkins era, B-CU is 38-1 (.974) when leading entering the final stanza. The lone loss was a 26-18 setback vs. S.C. State in 2011, a game in which the Cats led 15-12 heading into the fourth quarter.
- Senior defensive end Rony Barrow claimed a school record two safeties in the win over Norfolk State two weeks ago.

#5THINGS

1. Through the first 11 games, the Bethune-Cookman defense is ranked first nationally against the run.
2. Since dropping his first-ever Florida Blue Florida Classic with an unbeaten B-CU squad in 2010, head coach Brian Jenkins has won three consecutive against the Rattlers.
3. Just four opponents have rushed for 100 yards or more against the Wildcats over the last two MEAC seasons.
4. The current three-game win streak against FAMU is just the second time in school history the Wildcats have tallied three-straight wins over the Rattlers.
5. B-CU has forced three or more turnovers in 32 games under head coach Brian Jenkins.

#FASTDELIVERY

- Since his arrival in 2010, head coach Brian Jenkins has delivered the Speedway Offense to the Wildcats program.
- In 2014, Bethune-Cookman has tallied 10 scoring drives in which the Wildcats had three plays or less.
- In all but three games this season, the Wildcats have registered a scoring drive with three plays or less. Two of those games without were against FBS opponents FIU and UCF, respectively.

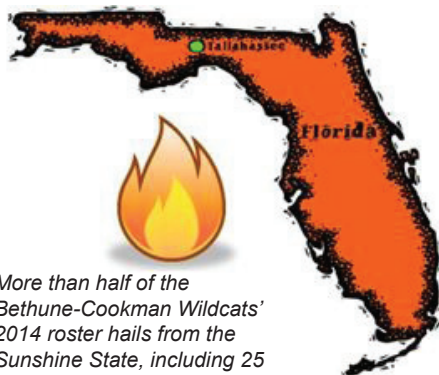
- Sophomore running back Michael D. Jones leads the Bethune-Cookman squad in rushing yards (630 / 57.3 pg) and fifth in receiving yards (155 / 15.5). He is the only Wildcat on this year's roster to have scored via rush and reception.

#PROCATS

- Bethune-Cookman has three active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the 2014 season.
- Ryan Davis (Jacksonville Jaguars), Rashean Mathis (Detroit Lions) and Eric Weems (Atlanta Falcons) are all participating for their respected teams.
- Davis has been a mainstay along the Jaguars' defensive line, registering three sacks and recovering a fumble so far on the year.



FLORIDA TALENT



More than half of the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats' 2014 roster hails from the Sunshine State, including 25 from either Miami-Dade County or Broward County.

SCORING STREAK

Bethune-Cookman has played 93 consecutive games without being shutout - the longest active streak in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. The last time the Wildcats were blanked came Nov. 11, 2006 — a 28-0 loss at Howard. Bethune-Cookman hasn't been shutout at home since Nov. 8, 1997 — a 27-0 loss to #9 Hampton.



CIRCLE THESE GUYS...



- Sophomore receiver Frank Brown is one of several in a talented group of receivers, averaging 19.0 yards per catch.
- With an average of 38.1 yards per game, Brown is 14th in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- Frank Brown joined Jontavious Carter (2013) as the only Wildcats in the last 10 years to record a touchdown as their first collegiate reception.
- He also has the longest pass reception on the team this year with a 67-yarder earlier in the year.



- Senior defensive tackle Rony Barrow may not have the numbers as last year, but he has been a menace in the offensive backfield this season.
- Two weeks ago at Norfolk State, he became the first player in school history to register two safeties in a single game, leading to the 13-7 come-from-behind win for the Wildcats on ESPN.
- In that contest, he amassed five tackles and a quarterback sack for the Maroon and Gold.

#SackLunch

Through 11 games of the 2014 season, the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats have registered 25 quarterback sacks by 12 different players, averaging 2.27 sacks per game. Last season, the Wildcats recorded 26 sacks by 11 different players in 13 games (an average of 2.0 per game).





A WIN OVER FLORIDA A&M WOULD...

- Give Bethune-Cookman its fourth consecutive victory over Florida A&M.
- Give Bethune-Cookman its 26th win as a ranked team under Brian Jenkins.
- Push the Wildcats' record in nationally-televised contests to 16-16 since 2004.
- Allow the Wildcats to stay within a half-game of the outright MEAC title.

THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

- Since the agreement with ESPN was put in place for the MEAC in 2005, the Wildcats have played in eight ESPNU Thursday night contests. The Wildcats hold a record of 5-3 in those contests, including wins in three of the last four games – all against Tidewater opponents Hampton and Norfolk State, respectively.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES...

- Through the last four games, the Bethune-Cookman defense has allowed just 224 yards of total offense in the second half. In that regards, 49 of those yards came on a scoring play at South Carolina State, ultimately leading to the Wildcats defeat in Orangeburg, S.C. on a last-minute TD reception.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?...

- Sophomore wide receiver **Frank Brown** has quickly become a scoring threat receiver for the Wildcats. He sits second the Wildcats roster with 381 receiving yards on 20 catches, adding four touchdowns on the campaign.
- Brown's first collegiate reception was a 55-yard touchdown pass from **Quentin Williams** in the victory at FIU.

DEFENSIVE MENTALITY...

- Entering the 12th week of the schedule, Bethune-Cookman's defense leads the the FCS in both rushing defense (79.5 ypg) and total defense (243.5 ypg). Under defensive coordinator Charles "Yogi" Jones, the Wildcats defense has been ranked in the top 20 statistically every season he's been in Daytona Beach.
- The defense ranks in a tie for eighth nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 8.6 per game behind the line.
- Though not forcing as many turnovers as years past, the B-CU defense is holding opponents to a near school-low for rushing yards per game.

TAKING A LOSS...

- The defensive pressure for Bethune-Cookman has been pinning its ears back and going straight forward. The Wildcats have amassed 94 tackles for loss, totaling 320 yards so far through 11 games. That ranks B-CU second in the MEAC, as well as tied for eighth nationally in that category.

#POLLPOSITION...

- This week, Bethune-Cookman is No. 25 in *The Sports Network* poll, while enjoying a No. 24 ranking in the FCS Coaches poll. This marks the 30th consecutive poll B-CU has been ranked in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches poll dating back to Week 10 of the 2012 season.

FINNIE STAKES HIS CLAIM...

- Senior cornerback Thomas Finnie picked off a career-best two passes at Savannah State, giving him three for his career in the Maroon and Gold.
- The second-year player who transferred from the University of Miami became the first Wildcat to collect two interceptions in a game since Michael Williams vs. Florida A&M in 2010.

BLOCK PARTY...

- While **Brian Jenkins** shares duties as special teams coordinator with assistant head coach **Terry Sims**, the Wildcats are tied for 12th in the nation for blocked kicks this season, owning five on the campaign.
- The Wildcats' special teams unit has blocked an extra point in three of the last five games.

THREE MINUTES OR LESS...

- The Speedway Offense has been a staple under head coach Brian Jenkins since his arrival in Daytona Beach back in 2010. This season, the Wildcats have 24 "lightning strikes" with scoring drives that have lasted three minutes or less.
- Of Bethune-Cookman's 51 drives resulting in touchdowns and/or field goals last season, 29 of them lasted less than three minutes, while 22 of those lasted two minutes or less.

ON TV...

- As the two-time defending MEAC champions, Bethune-Cookman is sought after for television exposure by numerous TV agencies, including the ESPN family of networks. This year, B-CU has a conference-leading five nationally-televised games, not including all home games streamed via the web at CatEyeNetwork.tv.

JORDAN TOPS 1,000...

- Senior running back **Anthony Jordan** topped 1,000 career rushing yards against Howard, on the strength of a 102-yard performance against Howard. The Atlanta native has battled injuries throughout his career with the Maroon and Gold, but has been a mainstay in the offensive backfield for the Cats the last two years.

- The Delray Beach, Florida native has shared time behind center with **Quentin Williams**, while passing for 401 yards and four touchdown strikes on 35-of-55 passing attempts. On the ground in the spread-option attack of offensive coordinator **Jim Pry**, Brihm has 170 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

WHAT'S MY LINE...

- The defensive line has been a staple of the defense for the Wildcats so far this season. Under the direction of **Earl Lane**, the defensive linemen have been getting to opposing quarterbacks with ease.
- Defensive ends **Erik Williams** and **LeBranden Richardson** have tallied 12 of the team's 25 total quarterback sacks.

STARTING FAST...

- In four of the last eight games, Bethune-Cookman has scored on its opening offensive possession to take the early lead.
- The Wildcats are 34-3 under head coach Brian Jenkins when scoring first.

DON'T BE IN A RUSH...

- Bethune-Cookman's rushing defense has been one of the best in the nation, statistically, under defensive coordinator **Charles "Yogi" Jones** for the past three years. This season appears to be no different.
- The Wildcats are ranked first nationally (tops in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference) in rushing defense, allowing just 79.5 yards per game.

NEW FACES AMONG THE CROWD...

- Bethune-Cookman head coach **Brian Jenkins** introduced several new coaches to the staff during the spring prior to the Spring Showcase.
- Veteran coach **Carl Franks** joined the staff as running back coach, while **Allen Suber** returned as wide receivers coach.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS...

- The 2014, Bethune-Cookman is 33-10 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State, FIU (x2) and Tennessee State. During that stretch, the Wildcats are 7-2 against teams from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC), including winning the last four consecutive against the fellow HBCU Division I conference.

REGULATION IS FINE...

- In the **Brian Jenkins** era, Bethune-Cookman has yet to play an overtime contest.
- In fact, the last overtime game for the Wildcats was a stunning 26-23 setback to Florida A&M in the 2005 *Walt Disney Florida Classic* game in Orlando.
- Throughout the history of the program, B-CU is 8-3 all-time in games going to overtime, including playing in the FCS' longest overtime games — an 80T contest against Virginia Stater in 1998, which the Cats won, 63-57.

PLAY MAKING DEFENSE...

- The Bethune-Cookman speedway offense may generate the most buzz among college football fans and media, but the B-CU defense has made more game-changing plays than any other defensive unit in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) since the start of 2012. The Wildcats lead the league with 74 takeaways over the course of the last 31 games.

#THATSRICH...



- Senior defensive end **LeBranden Richardson** comes into the 2014 season listed on the Preseason All-MEAC Team after finishing tied for second in total tackles on the Wildcats squad in 2013, registering 64 (31 solo).
- Richardson led the Cats with 14.5 tackles for loss, including amassing a second-best 4.5 sacks and four quarterback hurries.

2014 SCHEDULE...

- As usual, B-CU's 2014 schedule is challenging. Not only do the Wildcats face a pair of FCS opponents in FIU and UCF, but another key non-conference match-up includes the home-opening visit from Grambling State. B-CU plays five home games at Municipal Stadium in 2014. The Cats welcome in-state foe Florida Tech and SWAC member Grambling State, as well as MEAC contests against

JENKINS AT MUNICIPAL STADIUM...

- Head coach **Brian Jenkins** made his sideline debut at Municipal Stadium Sept. 4, 2010 (W, 70-10 vs. Edward Waters) after spending the prior season calling plays from the booth high above as Rutgers' wide receivers coach. Since Jenkins' arrival in 2010, the Wildcats are 23-5 at Municipal Stadium, averaging 34.24 points per game at home. Of the five losses at Municipal Stadium under Jenkins, two were post-season contests in the FCS Playoffs (2010 — vs. New Hampshire; 2012 — vs. Coastal Carolina).

IN THE CENTER OF THINGS...

- Senior offensive center **Andrew Edouard** has made a huge impact in just one year with the program. The Philadelphia, Pennsylvania native not only earned post-season All-America accolades a season ago, but also a member of two preseason teams heading into the 2014 campaign.
- Edouard is listed on the *Beyond Sports Network* Preseason All-America Team, as well as the All-MEAC Preseason squad.

HENDERSON, RICHARDSON ON CFPA PERFORMER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Senior defensive lineman **LeBrandon Richardson** and senior tight end **Justin Henderson** are among the names listed on the 2014 CFPA National Performer of the Year Watch List.
- Henderson and Richardson are two of 11 FCS players from HBCUs on the 2014 National Performer of the Year Watch List by College Football Performance Award.





BRIAN JENKINS

Head Coach, Fifth Season
Cincinnati, 1993

In just four years at the helm, Jenkins' 37-11 (.771) overall record stands as the best four-year performance of any coach to walk the B-CU sidelines. In fact, his 28-4 record in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference is unmatched by any coach beginning a four-year stretch at an MEAC institution. In 2012, he rushed his record to 27-8. Only B-CU Hall of Famer Charles W. Moore (with 27 wins) had as many victories in his first three years as a Wildcat head coach. In fact, his record from 2010-12 was the best of any Division I coach in the state of Florida in that span.

Of all the hires in the 2010 FCS class, Jenkins ranks first in winning percentage and third for wins amongst that class of coaching hires. Only Willie Fritz (Sam Houston) and Jeff Monken (Georgia Southern) have claimed more wins in the last three seasons. In 2013, Jenkins posted one of the biggest wins in both B-CU and MEAC history when the Wildcats defeated their first FBS opponent in the form of Florida International University (FIU) on the road in Miami. It was the first win for an MEAC school over an FBS opponent since Delaware State took down Akron in 1987, and just the fifth time in history an HBCU had defeated an FBS opponent. Other signature wins include at eventual MEAC Champion Norfolk State in 2011, and three consecutive wins against rival Florida A&M (2011-13). He also collected a key road win at Tennessee State in the John Merritt Classic (2013), in addition to South Carolina State (2012). Three of Jenkins' losses in his career have come to BCS opponents (Miami - 2011, '12; Florida State - 2013), and another three in the FCS playoffs.

In each of Jenkins' years with B-CU, the Wildcats have ranked among the national FCS leaders for scoring offense, rushing offense, total yardage, total defense and turnover margin, making his teams a formidable force not only in the MEAC, but also in the nation.

In 2013, Brian Jenkins led the Wildcats to their third league title in his four years at the helm in Daytona Beach. The feat would allow the Cats to secure a second consecutive trip to the NCAA FCS Playoffs, matching the school-record of two-straight under former head coach Alvin B. Wyatt, Sr., set in 2002-03. Jenkins would go on to pick up his third MEAC Coach of the Year award, while finishing the year as a finalist for the HBCU National Coach of the Year. The Wildcats finished the season ranked No. 16 in the final *The Sports Network* poll, marking the third-straight year the Cats have finished a season ranked in the national FCS polls. The 16th place ranking was the highest since 2010 when they ranked 15th.

In 2012, he led Bethune-Cookman to its second Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title in his three years with the Maroon and Gold, as well as the second time securing an automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs. The Wildcats would host their opening game for the third time in as many trips to the postseason, welcoming Coastal Carolina to Municipal Stadium on Thanksgiving weekend. In ending the league season with a perfect 8-0 record, Jenkins helped the Cats to their first undefeated MEAC season since 1984. Not only was it the first 8-0 mark in school history within the MEAC, but it was also a school record for conference wins in a single season. For these reasons and more, Jenkins walked away with his second MEAC Coach of the Year award, in addition to claiming FCS Region Two Coach of the Year honors. He concluded the year being tabbed *HBCU Huddle/*

Sporting News Coach of the Year, giving him three postseason awards for the first time in his career. Jenkins helped Bethune-Cookman finish the year with a No. 22 Sports Network ranking.

He was the 2010 MEAC Coach of the Year, *SBN Black College* Coach of the Year, AFCA Region Two Coach of the Year, and *BoxToRow/BASN* HBCU Coach of the Year. In addition, the Wildcats claimed their first HBCU National Championship after winning the first 10 games of the year, claiming a share of the MEAC title and appearing in the FCS postseason for the first time since 2003. Jenkins' offense produced a 2,000-yard passer, a pair of 500-yard receivers and another pair of 500-yard rushers. Bethune-Cookman amassed 5,107 yards of offense and scored 457 points - both single season school records.
