STORY LINES

- This marks the first-ever meeting between the Florida Tech Panthers and Bethune-Cookman Wildcats.
- Senior defensive LeBranden Richardson collected B-CU's only quarterback sack last weekend, returning to UCF to claim the stop in the second quarter.
- Bethune-Cookman owns an all-time record of 110-70-2 in the month of September.
- Senior quarterback **Quentin Williams** and redshirt freshman quarterback **Larry Brihm** each saw action under center last weekend at UCF, neither of them committing a turnover. In fact, Williams has yet to turn the ball over this season.
- The Bethune-Cookman defense is statistically ranked in the Top-15 of the NCAA FCS in four different categories, tied for seventh nationally in punt returns and tied for ninth in quarterback sacks.
- Senior quarterback **Quentin Williams** has not thrown an interception in his last 89 passing attempts, dating back to the Hampton game (11/16/13) a season ago at Municipal Stadium
- Fifth-year head coach **Brian Jenkins** has lost back-to-back games just three times in his career with the Maroon and Gold. On two of those occasions, the second loss was followed from a loss to an FBS Opponent — Miami in 2011 and 2012.
- Despite a 41-7 setback to UCF last weekend, the Wildcats dropped just three spots in The Sports Network poll to No. 15, while dropping just two in the FCS Coaches poll down to No. 14. Bethune-Cookman has been ranked in the Top 25 for a school record 22 consecutive polls, or a span of 135 calendar weeks.
- Senior center **Andrew Edouard** has been named to the Preseason All-MEAC and *Beyond Sports Network* preseason teams.
- The Wildcats rank 119 out of 121 in the fewest penalty yards per game in the 2014 campaign, amassing an average of 124.4 yards per contest. Only Sacramento State (125 p/g) and Alabama State (132.4) have a higher average.
- The defense lost a lot of starters from a season ago, but those holes were plugged quickly. Preseason All-MEAC selection **LeBranden Richardson** and linebacker **Ralph Williams, Jr.** look to lead the bunch. They will be joined by Preseason All-MEAC selection linebacker **Tavarus Dantzler** and defensive back **Thomas Finnie**.
- Tight end **Justin Henderson** and defensive end **LeBranden Richardson** have each been named to the *College Football Performance Awards* Preseason Watch List.

#5THINGS

1. This will mark the first-ever meeting between the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats and Florida Tech Panthers.
2. Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman has compiled a record of 5-1 against Division II opponents. That includes a 4-1 record at home.
3. Bethune-Cookman comes into the game ranked in the top 10 statistically for punt returns, sacks and total defense.
4. Under head coach Brian Jenkins, B-CU has a record of 5-5 against Florida teams, with four of those losses coming to Florida State, Miami and UCF, collectively.
5. Head coach Brian Jenkins is in his fifth year with the Wildcats program. He has led B-CU to the FCS Playoffs in three of four years to date.

#BALLCONTROL

- In the Brian Jenkins era, Bethune-Cookman has scored 30+ points on 23 separate occasions.
- In those 23 games, the B-CU offense has controlled the ball an average of 34 minutes and 11 seconds
- Only seven times has B-CU controlled the ball less than its opponent in those 20 contests...

- Redshirt junior quarterback **Quentin Williams** has been steady under center thus far for the Wildcats. In three games, the Tampa, Florida native has yet to throw an interception, connecting on 63.8 percent of his passes.

#PROCATS

- Bethune-Cookman has three active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the opening of the 2014 season.
- Ryan Davis (Jacksonville Jaguars), Rashean Mathis (Detroit Lions) and Eric Weems (Atlanta Falcons) are all participating for their respected teams.
- Davis has been a mainstay along the Jaguars' defensive line, registering three sacks and recovering a fumble so far on the year.




WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?...

- Sophomore wide receiver **Frank Brown** has quickly become a possession guy for the Wildcats. He leads all B-CU receivers with 101 yards and a touchdown on just four receptions.
- Last season, Brown saw limited action on special teams for the Wildcats, but did not record a statistic.
- Brown's first collegiate reception was a 55-yard touchdown pass from quarterback **Quentin Williams** in the victory at FIU.



SCORING STREAK

Bethune-Cookman has played 85 consecutive games without being shutout - the longest active streak in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. The last time the Wildcats were blanked came Nov. 11, 2006 — a 28-0 loss at Howard. Bethune-Cookman hasn't been shutout at home since Nov. 8, 1997 — a 27-0 loss to #9 Hampton.



CIRCLE THESE GUYS...



- Wide receiver **Jaime Wilson** has quickly emerged as a go-to receiver for quarterback **Quentin Williams** and the offense.
- In his first year with the program, Wilson has accumulated three catches for 33 yards.
- He has played in all three games as wide-out, and started in one on the campaign.
- His average of 11.0 yards per game is currently fourth on the squad in that category.
- Wilson transferred into the program in the spring from Western Michigan, and is a native of Belle Glade, Florida, playing formerly at powerhouse Glades Central High School.



- Senior strong safety **Marquis Drayton** stepped into the starting lineup last year for B-CU, and has yet to relinquish his starting position.
- Currently, he's third on the team in total tackles, having amassed 18 through three games.
- Drayton has a team-leading four pass breakups thus far on the campaign.
- Eight of his tackles have come by way of a solo performance, while he's assisted on 10 other tackles, averaging 6.0 tackles per contest.

#SackLunch

Through the first three games of the 2014 season, the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats have registered 10 quarterback sacks by three different players, averaging 3.33 sacks per game. Last season, the Wildcats recorded 26 sacks by 11 different players in 13 games (an average of 2.0 per game).



A WIN OVER FLORIDA TECH WOULD...

- Improve Bethune-Cookman's home winning streak to three consecutive games dating back to 2013.
- Give Bethune-Cookman its third win on Church & Community Day under Brian Jenkins.
- Improve Brian Jenkins' record to 3-0 all-time against Division II opponents.
- Bump Brian Jenkins' record to 12-4 all-time in the month of September.
- Give Bethune-Cookman a win in its 794th game all-time in school history.

A QUICK LOOK AT FLORIDA TECH...

- This weekend's opponent, Florida Tech, comes into the game with an unblemished 3-0 record, including a 54-12 win over Stetson in their season-opener. Their other wins include outings against Ave Maria (42-6) and No. 12 Tarleton State (37-31). The Panthers play in one of the toughest Division II leagues in the nation, with perennial national powers Delta State, North Alabama, Valdosta State and West Alabama frequenting their schedule. The Gulf South Conference has produced more Division II national champions over the past 10 years than any other conference.
- Florida Tech is averaging a whopping 44.3 points per game, and uses a very balanced attack to light up the scoreboard. The Panthers average 195.7 yards per game on the ground, while passing for 285 yards per contest. In all, they are chunking up more than 480 yards per game on average.
- FIT looks towards Trevor Sand to supply the yards on the ground. Sand averages just under 91 yards per game, with quarterback Mark Cato averaging right at 36 yards per game. Cato has passed for 666 yards and nine touchdowns this season, rushing for two more. He has completed 56 percent of his passes (42-of-75) with just a single interception.
- Cato's primary receivers are Xavier Milton and Aaron George. Milton has two touchdown receptions and 303 yards on 15 catches. Meanwhile, George has a team-leading four touchdown receptions with 162 yards receiving on just eight total catches.

IT WAS SEPTEMBER...

- In the month of September, Bethune-Cookman has an all-time record of 110-70-2.

ON TV...

- As the two-time defending MEAC champions, Bethune-Cookman is sought after for television exposure by numerous TV agencies, including the ESPN family of networks. This year, B-CU has a conference-leading five nationally-televised games, not including all home games streamed via the web at CatEyeNetwork.tv.

WHAT'S MY LINE?...

- The defensive line has been a staple of the defense for the Wildcats so far this season. Under the direction of **Earl Lane**, the defensive linemen have been getting to opposing quarterbacks with ease.
- **Erik Williams**, **LeBranden Richardson**, **Rony Barrow** and **DiShawn Ray** have amassed 37 of the team's 192 total tackles between the four of them.
- Williams and Richardson have tallied seven of the team's 10 total quarterback sacks.

DON'T BE IN A RUSH...

- Bethune-Cookman's rushing defense has been one of the best in the nation, statistically, under defensive coordinator **Charles "Yogi" Jones** for the past three years. This season appears to be no different.
- The Wildcats are ranked 12th nationally in rushing defense, allowing just 86.3 yards per game.

- The defensive pressure for Bethune-Cookman has been turned all the way up this season. The Wildcats have amassed 22 tackles for loss, totaling 62 yards so far through two games. That ranks the Cats second in the MEAC, as well as 34th nationally in that department.

RUSHING TO A CONCLUSION...

- Redshirt sophomore running back **Danny Dillard** saw his first action of the season two weeks again at home against Grambling State. The University of Miami transfer picked up 55 yards on eight carries, rushing into the end zone one as well.
- A week ago at UCF, he collected his first collegiate starting job in the backfield.

In the season-opener at FIU, the Wildcats had newcomers Larry Brihm, Jaime Wilson, Jeremy Davis, Michael Westray, James Darby II, Arthur Williams, Leroy Holt, Michael Butler, Brice Hawkes, Alexander Morales, Haden Hoggarth, Robert Way, Korey Harris, Romia Wilson, Don'Kevious Johnson, Murphy Allen, Ciavy Wiles, Julian Johnson and David Perry made their way onto the field for playing time in the win over the FBS opponent from Miami.

#POLLPOSITION...

• This week, Bethune-Cookman is No. 15 in *The Sports Network* poll, while sitting at No. 14 in the FCS Coaches poll. This marks the 22nd consecutive poll B-CU has been ranked in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches poll dating back to Week 10 of the 2012 season.

NEW FACES AMONG THE CROWD...

• Bethune-Cookman head coach **Brian Jenkins** introduced several new coaches to the staff during the spring prior to the Spring Showcase.

• Veteran coach **Carl Franks** joined the staff as running back coach, while **Allen Suber** returned as wide receivers coach.

QUITE FRANKLY...

• Former Duke University head coach, and an assistant at USF and Florida, respectively, **Carl Franks** joins the Bethune-Cookman staff for the 2014 season in charge of the running backs.

IT'S A FLORIDA THING...

• On this year's roster, Bethune-Cookman has a total of 66 players hailing from the Sunshine State. With the nation flocking to Florida for recruiting purposes, the Wildcats have started to lock down the state within the FCS division, keeping talent at "home".

RETURN MEN...

• The 2014 Bethune-Cookman roster has 48 letterwinners, including 10 starters – five offense and three on defense (two on special teams). By contrast, the 2013 squad had 56 returning lettermen and 16 starters.

#THATSRICH...

• Senior defensive end **LeBranden Richardson** comes into the 2014 season listed on the Preseason All-MEAC Team after finishing tied for second in total tackles on the Wildcats squad in 2013, registering 64 (31 solo).

• Richardson led the Cats with 14.5 tackles for loss, including amassing a second-best 4.5 sacks and four quarterback hurries.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS...

• The 2014, Bethune-Cookman is 33-10 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State, FIU (x2) and Tennessee State. During that stretch, the Wildcats are 7-2 against teams from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC), including



winning the last four consecutive against the fellow HBCU Division I conference.

COACHING CONTINUITY...

- An often overlooked facet of Bethune-Cookman's run of success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. Fifth-year head coach **Brian Jenkins** is supported by several assistants who have served in at least three-of-four seasons with him on staff. These coaches include **Charles "Yogi" Jones** (Defensive Coordinator), **Earl Lane** (Defensive Line), **Lawal McCray** (Tight Ends), **John Powers** (Offensive Line), **Jim Pry** (Offensive Coordinator), **Terry Sims** (Safeties) and **Terry Williams** (Defensive Backs).

LEFT SIDE, STRONG SIDE...

- Senior defensive ends **Erik Williams** and **LeBranden Richardson** proved to be a force against the FIU Panthers on both sides of the defensive line.
- Williams registered a career-high three quarterback sacks and two hurries.
- Meanwhile, Richardson posted three tackles for loss – including a sack.

MUNICIPAL STADIUM RENOVATIONS...

- Members of the media, as well as fans visiting Municipal Stadium this year, will notice several renovations taking place, following the historic partnership between Bethune-Cookman and the City of Daytona Beach.
- The visiting radio booth is being used by the home radio station, while the coaches' booths have been switched to allow for stadium operations to power and man the newly approved jumbo scoreboard (installation beginning in October).
- Visiting radio will be housed on the fourth floor for the 2014 season, and the B-CU Office of Communications will provide any and all necessary assistance for those crews throughout the year.

LIGHTNING STRIKES...

- Against FIU, Bethune-Cookman's opening drive spanned 59 yards on just five plays, taking just 1:20 off the clock – resulting in the Cats' first "lightning strike" of 2014. The other scoring drive spanned 3:34 and went 80 yards on eight plays, capped by **Frank Brown's** 55-yard reception from **Quentin Williams**.
- Of Bethune-Cookman's 51 drives resulting in touchdowns and/or field goals last season, 25 of them lasted less than three minutes, while 18 of those lasted two minutes or less.

PLAY MAKING DEFENSE...

- The Bethune-Cookman speedway offense may generate the most buzz among college football fans and media, but the B-CU defense has made more game-changing plays than any other defensive unit in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) since the start of 2012. The Wildcats lead the league with 60 takeaways over the course of the last 26 games.

REGULATION IS FINE...

- In the **Brian Jenkins** era, Bethune-Cookman has yet to play an overtime contest.
- In fact, the last overtime game for the Wildcats was a stunning 26-23 setback to Florida A&M in the 2005 *Walt Disney Florida Classic* game in Orlando.
- Throughout the history of the program, B-CU is 8-3 all-time in games going to overtime, including playing in the FCS' longest overtime games – an 80T contest against Virginia Stater in 1998, which the Cats won, 63-57.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER...

- Every week on the MEAC Coaches Teleconference, **Brian Jenkins** is asked about who will start at quarterback. The answer has, and always will be, that the Wildcats have a "three-headed monster" behind center in the form of three capable signal callers. B-CU has SR **Quentin Williams**, R-FR **Larry Brihm** and SR **Brett Maxie, Jr.** all with unique skills, and Jenkins has each of them ready to go at any given moment to take over the reigns of the offense in a contest.



IN THE CENTER OF THINGS...

- Senior offensive center **Andrew Edouard** has made a huge impact in just one year with the program. The Philadelphia, Pennsylvania native not only earned post-season All-America accolades a season ago, but also a member of two preseason teams heading into the 2014 campaign.
- Edouard is listed on the *Beyond Sports Network* Preseason All-America Team, as well as the All-MEAC Preseason squad.

HEAD COACH BRIAN JENKINS...

- In just four seasons, **Brian Jenkins** has

threatened to redefine the 90-year history of football at Bethune-Cookman University. It started in 2010 in his first year as the Wildcats' head coach, coming from Rutgers as an assistant coach. Throughout the duration has been an emergence of a program among the nation's elite behind the architect of one of the most prolific offenses in the entire Football Championship Subdivision. No other coach in school history has guided the football team to three Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) titles in his first four years on the job. Only Oliver "Buddy" Pough of South Carolina State holds just two (2) more league titles than Jenkins with five total, but that coming in a 12-year span. Adding to that, only S.C. State's Bill Davis succeeded in doing so as a first-year coach. In the process of accumulating a 39-12 ledger in his fifth year at the helm, the three-time conference coach of the year has decked three FCS Playoff appearances into his file, another school-best at B-CU. In addition to accumulating a mark of 28-4 in league play, his .765 overall winning percentage is the highest in school history and his .875 percentage in conference play is the best by any fifth-year head coach in league annals.



EXPLOSION PLAYS

- In 2013, Bethune-Cookman accumulated 27 "explosion plays" of 25 yards or more from scrimmage. Of that number, the Wildcats return six players in 2014 who accounted for 12 of those "big plays," including two by SR QB **Quentin Williams** and four from R-JR WR **Jontavious Carter**. A staple of Bethune-Cookman's "Speedway" offensive attack, the Wildcats have averaged 2.33 "explosion plays" per game this season.

TWO MORE FBS...

- For the second time in as many years, Bethune-Cookman is traveling to play two (2) FBS opponents on the campaign. Last year, the Wildcats split a pair of games with FIU and eventual BCS National Champion Florida State. This season, B-CU AGAIN plays a BCS Bowl opponent, taking on Tostito's Fiesta Bowl reigning champion UCF in Orlando on Sept. 20, as well as opening the year at FBS opponent FIU.

2014 SCHEDULE...

- As usual, B-CU's 2014 schedule is challenging. Not only do the Wildcats face a pair of FCS opponents in FIU and UCF, but another key non-conference match-up includes the home-opening visit from Grambling State. B-CU plays five home games at Municipal Stadium in 2014. The Cats welcome in-state foe Florida Tech and SWAC member Grambling State, as well as MEAC contests against Delaware State, Howard (Homecoming) and North Carolina Central, respectively. As always, the regular season slate concludes with the annual *Florida Blue Florida Classic* against Florida A&M at the Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Florida. B-CU's Homecoming game against Howard is one of the most anticipated games of the year, and is expected to sell out in the coming weeks.

#30SOMETHING...

- The Wildcats have won 25 straight games when scoring 30+ points and are 29-1 in their last 30 contests.
- Bethune-Cookman's last loss when scoring 30+ in a game? Nov. 22, 2008 – a 58-35 loss against Florida A&M in Orlando, Florida.

- Head coach **Brian Jenkins** made his sideline debut at Municipal Stadium Sept. 4, 2010 (W, 70-10 vs. Edward Waters) after spending the prior season calling plays from the booth high above as Rutgers' wide receivers coach. Since Jenkins' arrival in 2010, the Wildcats are 20-5 at Municipal Stadium, averaging 37.14 points per game at home. Of the five losses at Municipal Stadium under Jenkins, two were post-season contests in the FCS Playoffs (2010 – vs. New Hampshire; 2012 – vs. Coastal Carolina).

HENDERSON, RICHARDSON ON CFPA PERFORMER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Senior defensive lineman **LeBrandon Richardson** and senior tight end **Justin Henderson** are among the names listed on the 2014 CFPA National Performer of the Year Watch List.
- Henderson and Richardson are two of 11 FCS players from HBCUs on the 2014 National Performer of the Year Watch List by College Football Performance Award.

WILDCATS CONTINUE HIGH APR MARKS

- Bethune-Cookman University finished in the top five of the MEAC in 10 of the 17 sponsored sports, and led the MEAC with the highest APR mark in football, men's cross country, softball and women's golf.
- The school also enjoyed second place rankings in men's basketball, baseball, men's indoor track & field, and men's outdoor track & field. Men's golf and men's tennis each finished fifth in the multi-year rankings.
- Four B-CU teams collected APR scores of .976 or better, including women's golf with a perfect 100 percent academic progress rate (APR).
- Football finished with a .935, allowing them to finish in the top half of the league for that particular sport.

BRIAN JENKINS

**Head Coach, Fifth Season
Cincinnati, 1993**

In just four years at the helm, Jenkins' 37-11 (.771) overall record stands as the best four-year performance of any coach to walk the B-CU sidelines. In fact, his 28-4 record in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference is unmatched by any coach beginning a four-year stretch at an MEAC institution. In 2012, he rushed his record to 27-8. Only B-CU Hall of Famer Charles W. Moore (with 27 wins) had as many victories in his first three years as a Wildcat head coach. In fact, his record from 2010-12 was the best of any Division I coach in the state of Florida in that span.

Of all the hires in the 2010 FCS class, Jenkins ranks first in winning percentage and third for wins amongst that class of coaching hires. Only Willie Fritz (Sam Houston) and Jeff Monken (Georgia Southern) have claimed more wins in the last three seasons. In 2013, Jenkins posted one of the biggest wins in both B-CU and MEAC history when the Wildcats defeated their first FBS opponent in the form of Florida International University (FIU) on the road in Miami. It was the first win for an MEAC school over an FBS opponent since Delaware State took down Akron in 1987, and just the fifth time in history an HBCU had defeated an FBS opponent. Other signature wins include at eventual MEAC Champion Norfolk State in 2011, and three consecutive wins against rival Florida A&M (2011-13). He also collected a key road win at Tennessee State in the John Merritt Classic (2013), in addition to South Carolina State (2012). Three of Jenkins' losses in his career have come to BCS opponents (Miami - 2011, '12; Florida State - 2013), and another three in the FCS playoffs.

In each of Jenkins' years with B-CU, the Wildcats have ranked among the national FCS leaders for scoring offense, rushing offense, total yardage, total defense and turnover margin, making his teams a formidable force not only in the MEAC, but also in the nation.

In 2013, Brian Jenkins led the Wildcats to their third league title in his four years at the helm in Daytona Beach. The feat would allow the Cats to secure a second consecutive trip to the NCAA FCS Playoffs, matching the school-record of two-straight under former head coach Alvin B. Wyatt, Sr., set in 2002-03. Jenkins would go on to pick up his third MEAC Coach of the Year award, while finishing the year as a finalist for the HBCU National Coach of the Year. The Wildcats finished the season ranked No. 16 in the final *The Sports Network* poll, marking the third-straight year the Cats have finished a season ranked in the national FCS polls. The 16th place ranking was the highest since 2010 when they ranked 15th.

In 2012, he led Bethune-Cookman to its second Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title in his three years with the Maroon and Gold, as well as the second time securing an automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs. The Wildcats would host their opening game for the third time in as many trips to the postseason, welcoming Coastal Carolina to Municipal Stadium on Thanksgiving weekend. In ending the league season with a perfect 8-0 record, Jenkins helped the Cats to their first undefeated MEAC season since 1984. Not only was it the first 8-0 mark in school history within the MEAC, but it was also a school record for conference wins in a single season. For these reasons and more, Jenkins walked away with his second MEAC Coach of the Year award, in addition to claiming FCS Region Two Coach of the Year honors. He concluded the year being tabbed *HBCU Huddle/*

Sporting News Coach of the Year, giving him three postseason awards for the first time in his career. Jenkins helped Bethune-Cookman finish the year with a No. 22 Sports Network ranking.

He was the 2010 MEAC Coach of the Year, *SBN Black College* Coach of the Year, AFCA Region Two Coach of the Year, and *BoxToRow/BASN HBCU* Coach of the Year. In addition, the Wildcats claimed their first HBCU National Championship after winning the first 10 games of the year, claiming a share of the MEAC title and appearing in the FCS postseason for the first time since 2003. Jenkins' offense produced a 2,000-yard passer, a pair of 500-yard receivers and another pair of 500-yard rushers. Bethune-Cookman amassed 5,107 yards of offense and scored 457 points - both single season school records.
