## STORY LINES

- Bethune-Cookman holds a 4-1 record all-time against North Carolina Central, with all four wins coming in the last four consecutive meetings from 2010-13.
- Despite a loss last weekend at South Carolina State, Bethune-Cookman can still earn a share of its third consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title if the Wildcats win their remaining four games.
- The Bethune-Cookman defense is currently ranked number one in FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) in total defense, allowing just 249.1 yards per game. The Cats are also second nationally against the rush, allowing 74.0 yards per game.
- The Wildcats will honor a total of 24 seniors this weekend, all of whom are playing in their last regular season home game for the Maroon and Gold.
- In 2014, 17 different Bethune-Cookman players have caught at least one pass for the Wildcats. Last season, a total of 19 players caught at least one pass for the Wildcats.

## #5THINGS

1. Through the first eight games, the Bethune-Cookman defense is ranked first nationally against the run.
2. Bethune-Cookman's offensive unit has tallied 22 plays of 25 yards or more.
3. Three Wildcats are in the top 10 statistically among MEAC leaders in tackles for loss.
4. Bethune-Cookman has not allowed an MEAC opponent to rush for 100 yards this season.
5. B-CU has forced three or more turnovers in 32 games under head coach Brian Jenkins, including the last two consecutive.

## #FASTDELIVERY

- Since his arrival in 2010, head coach Brian Jenkins has delivered the Speedway Offense to the Wildcats program.
- In 2014, Bethune-Cookman has used eight scoring drives in which the Wildcats had three plays or less.
- In all but two games this season, the Wildcats have registered a scoring drive with three plays or less. Those two games without were against FBS opponents FIU and UCF, respectively.

- Sophomore running back Michael D. Jones is second on the Bethune-Cookman squad in rushing yards (371 / 46.4 pg) and receiving yards (128 / 16.0 pg). He is the only Wildcat on this year's roster to have scored via rush and reception.

## #PROCATS

- Bethune-Cookman has three active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the opening of the 2014 season.
- Ryan Davis (Jacksonville Jaguars), Rashean Mathis (Detroit Lions) and Eric Weems (Atlanta Falcons) are all participating for their respected teams.
- Davis has been a mainstay along the Jaguars' defensive line, registering three sacks and recovering a fumble so far on the year.



## FLORIDA TALENT



More than half of the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats' 2014 roster hails from the Sunshine State, including 25 from either Miami-Dade County or Broward County.

## SCORING STREAK

Bethune-Cookman has played 90 consecutive games without being shutout - the longest active streak in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. The last time the Wildcats were blanked came Nov. 11, 2006 — a 28-0 loss at Howard. Bethune-Cookman hasn't been shutout at home since Nov. 8, 1997 — a 27-0 loss to #9 Hampton.



## CIRCLE THESE GUYS...



- Sophomore receiver Frank Brown leads a talented group of Wildcat receivers with an average of 20.4 yards per catch on the year.
- With an average of 40.9 yards per game, Brown is 10th in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- Brown is tied for 51st nationally, alongside teammate Jhomo Gordon, with a team-best four receiving touchdowns.
- Frank Brown joined Jontavious Carter (2013) as the only Wildcats in the last 10 years to record a touchdown as their first collegiate reception.
- He also has the longest pass reception on the team this year with a 67-yarder earlier in the year.



- Senior center Andrew Edouard has been a staple as the offensive center for the Wildcats since his arrival from Lackawanna CC in 2013.
- The Philadelphia native has registered double-digit pancakes in 2014, while finishing second the squad in that category a season ago.
- Edouard is one of two starting offensive linemen not to have a false start penalty assessed against him this season for the Wildcats.
- He has helped pave the way for the B-CU offense to accumulate an average of 350.3 yards per game, while allowing quarterbacks Larry Brihm and Quentin Williams to record high passing efficiency.

## #SackLunch

Through eight games of the 2014 season, the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats have registered 18 quarterback sacks by seven different players, averaging 2.25 sacks per game. Last season, the Wildcats recorded 26 sacks by 11 different players in 13 games (an average of 2.0 per game).



## A WIN OVER NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL WOULD...

- Give Bethune-Cookman its fifth consecutive win over the Eagles.
- Give Bethune-Cookman its 24th win as a ranked team under Brian Jenkins.
- Keep Bethune-Cookman perfect at home in 2014, with a 5-0 record.
- Allow the Wildcats to stay within a half-game of the outright MEAC title.
- Give Bethune-Cookman a win in its 799th game all-time in school history.

## A QUICK LOOK AT NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL...

- Since the start of the transition to the FCS level in 2007, NCCU is 0-8 against nationally-ranked FCS opponents. The Eagles have been out-scored 335-98 (41.9 / 12.3 avg.) in those contests.
- NCCU sophomore quarterback Malcolm Bell has thrown for more than 200 yards and a touchdown in six consecutive games.
- Sophomore quarterback Malcolm Bell and sophomore center Carl Jones have been honored by the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference for their performances during the Eagles' 42-14 win over Savannah State last weekend.
- NCCU junior Adrian Wilkins leads the MEAC in receptions per game (5.9) and receiving yards per game (70.3).

## WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?...

- Sophomore wide receiver **Frank Brown** has quickly become a scoring threat receiver for the Wildcats. He leads all B-CU receivers with 282 yards and four touchdowns on just 12 receptions.
- Brown is tied for 37th in the FCS with four receiving touchdowns on the 2014 campaign.
- Brown's first collegiate reception was a 55-yard touchdown pass from **Quentin Williams** in the victory at FIU.

## DEFENSIVE MENTALITY...

- Entering the ninth week of the schedule, Bethune-Cookman's defense is ranked second nationally in the FCS for total defense, allowing just 249.1 yards per game through its first eight contests. The Wildcats lead the nation in rushing yards allowed.
- The defense ranks tied for ninth nationally in tackles for loss, averaging right at 8.6 per game.
- Bethune-Cookman has already recovered 10 fumbles and has intercepted six passes in 2014.

## TAKING A LOSS...

- The defensive pressure for Bethune-Cookman has been turned all the way up this season. The Wildcats have amassed 68 tackles for loss, totaling 217 yards so far through the first eight games. That ranks the Cats second in the MEAC, as well as tied for ninth nationally in that category.

## A GOOD OPPONENT...

- Both of Bethune-Cookman's losses in 2014 have come on the road, at UCF and South Carolina State, respectively.
- The combined record for those two teams entering the ninth week of the season is a respectable 10-5, with UCF having won their last five consecutive.

## FINNIE STAKES HIS CLAIM...

- Senior cornerback Thomas Finnie picked off a career-best two passes at Savannah State, giving him three for his career in the Maroon and Gold.
- The second-year player who transferred from the University of Miami became the first Wildcat to collect two interceptions in a game since Michael Williams vs. Florida A&M in 2010.

## THREE MINUTES OR LESS...

- The Speedway Offense has been a staple under head coach Brian Jenkins since his arrival in Daytona Beach back in 2010. This season, the Wildcats have 18 "lightning strikes" with scoring drives that have lasted three minutes or less.
- Of Bethune-Cookman's 51 drives resulting in touchdowns and/or field goals last season, 25 of them lasted less than three minutes, while 18 of those lasted two minutes or less.

## IN THE MONTH OF OCTOBER...

- Bethune-Cookman holds an all-time record of 196-132-13 in the month of October, dating back to 1925.

## ON TV...

- As the two-time defending MEAC champions, Bethune-Cookman is sought after for television exposure by numerous TV agencies, including the ESPN family of networks. This year, B-CU has a conference-leading five nationally-televised games, not including all home games streamed via the web at CatEyeNetwork.tv.

## JORDAN TOPS 1,000...

- Senior running back **Anthony Jordan** topped 1,000 career rushing yards against Howard, on the strength of a 102-yard performance against Howard. The Atlanta native has battled injuries throughout his career with the Maroon and Gold, but has been a mainstay in the offensive backfield for the Cats the last two years.

## GOT A "Q", GET AN ANSWER...

- Senior quarterback **Quentin Williams** had his string of 124 consecutive passes without an interception streak snapped against Delaware State.
- The Tampa native is enjoying one of his best years under center for the Cats. He sits 13th in the nation for passing efficiency, using a 151.2 rating. He ranks 25th nationally for passing yards per completion (13.19 y/c).

## WHAT'S MY LINE?...

- The defensive line has been a staple of the defense for the Wildcats so far this season. Under the direction of **Earl Lane**, the defensive linemen have been getting to opposing quarterbacks with ease.
- Defensive ends **Erik Williams** and **LeBranden Richardson** have tallied 10 of the team's 18 total quarterback sacks.

## STARTING FAST...

- In four of the last five games, Bethune-Cookman has scored on its opening offensive possession to take the early lead.
- The Wildcats are 33-3 under head coach Brian Jenkins when scoring first.

## DON'T BE IN A RUSH...

- Bethune-Cookman's rushing defense has been one of the best in the nation, statistically, under defensive coordinator **Charles "Yogi" Jones** for the past three years. This season appears to be no different.
- The Wildcats are ranked first nationally (tops in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference) in rushing defense, allowing just 74.0 yards per game.

## RUSHING TO A CONCLUSION...

- Redshirt sophomore running back **Danny Dillard** saw his first action of the season in the home-opener against Grambling State. The University of Miami transfer picked up 55 yards on eight carries, rushing into the end zone one as well.
- At UCF, he collected his first collegiate starting job in the backfield.

## #POLLPOSITION...

- This week, Bethune-Cookman is No. 21 in *The Sports Network* poll, while enjoying a No. 20 ranking in the FCS Coaches poll. This marks the 27th consecutive poll B-CU has been ranked in either *The Sports Network* or FCS Coaches poll dating back to Week 10 of the 2012 season.

- Bethune-Cookman head coach **Brian Jenkins** introduced several new coaches to the staff during the spring prior to the Spring Showcase.
- Veteran coach **Carl Franks** joined the staff as running back coach, while **Allen Suber** returned as wide receivers coach.

## QUITE FRANKLY...

- Former Duke University head coach, and an assistant at USF and Florida, respectively, **Carl Franks** joins the Bethune-Cookman staff for the 2014 season in charge of the running backs.

## IT'S A FLORIDA THING...

- On this year's roster, Bethune-Cookman has a total of 66 players hailing from the Sunshine State. With the nation flocking to Florida for recruiting purposes, the Wildcats have started to lock down the state within the FCS division, keeping talent at "home".

## NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS...

- The 2014, Bethune-Cookman is 33-10 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State, FIU (x2) and Tennessee State. During that stretch, the Wildcats are 7-2 against teams from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC), including winning the last four consecutive against the fellow HBCU Division I conference.

## MUNICIPAL STADIUM RENOVATIONS...

- Members of the media, as well as fans visiting Municipal Stadium this year, will notice several renovations taking place, following the historic partnership between Bethune-Cookman and the City of Daytona Beach.
- The visiting radio booth is being used by the home radio station, while the coaches' booths have been switched to allow for stadium operations to power and man the newly approved jumbo scoreboard.
- Visiting radio will be housed on the third floor (opposite the official stats crew) for the 2014 season, and the B-CU Office of Athletics Communications will provide any and all necessary assistance for those crews throughout the year.

## REGULATION IS FINE...

- In the **Brian Jenkins** era, Bethune-Cookman has yet to play an overtime contest.
- In fact, the last overtime game for the Wildcats was a stunning 26-23 setback to Florida A&M in the 2005 *Walt Disney Florida Classic* game in Orlando.
- Throughout the history of the program, B-CU is 8-3 all-time in games going to overtime, including playing in the FCS' longest overtime games — an 80T contest against Virginia Stater in 1998, which the Cats won, 63-57.

## PLAY MAKING DEFENSE...

- The Bethune-Cookman speedway offense may generate the most buzz among college football fans and media, but the B-CU defense has made more game-changing plays than any other defensive unit in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) since the start of 2012. The Wildcats lead the league with 71 takeaways over the course of the last 29 games.



## #THATSRICH...

- Senior defensive end **LeBranden Richardson** comes into the 2014 season listed on the Preseason All-MEAC Team after finishing tied for second in total tackles on the Wildcats squad in 2013, registering 64 (31 solo).
- Richardson led the Cats with 14.5 tackles for loss, including amassing a second-best 4.5 sacks and four quarterback hurries.

## 2014 SCHEDULE...

- As usual, B-CU's 2014 schedule is challenging. Not only do the Wildcats face a pair of FCS opponents in FIU and UCF, but another key non-conference match-up includes the home-opening visit from Grambling State. B-CU plays five home games at Municipal Stadium in 2014. The Cats

## BRIAN JENKINS

**Head Coach, Fifth Season**  
**Cincinnati, 1993**

In just four years at the helm, Jenkins' 37-11 (.771) overall record stands as the best four-year performance of any coach to walk the B-CU sidelines. In fact, his 28-4 record in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference is unmatched by any coach beginning a four-year stretch at an MEAC institution. In 2012, he rushed his record to 27-8. Only B-CU Hall of Famer Charles W. Moore (with 27 wins) had as many victories in his first three years as a Wildcat head coach. In fact, his record from 2010-12 was the best of any Division I coach in the state of Florida in that span.

Of all the hires in the 2010 FCS class, Jenkins ranks first in winning percentage and third for wins amongst that class of coaching hires. Only Willie Fritz (Sam Houston) and Jeff Monken (Georgia Southern) have claimed more wins in the last three seasons. In 2013, Jenkins posted one of the biggest wins in both B-CU and MEAC history when the Wildcats defeated their first FBS opponent in the form of Florida International University (FIU) on the road in Miami. It was the first win for an MEAC school over an FBS opponent since Delaware State took down Akron in 1987, and just the fifth time in history an HBCU had defeated an FBS opponent. Other signature wins include at eventual MEAC Champion Norfolk State in 2011, and three consecutive wins against rival Florida A&M (2011-13). He also collected a key road win at Tennessee State in the John Merritt Classic (2013), in addition to South Carolina State (2012). Three of Jenkins' losses in his career have come to BCS opponents (Miami - 2011, '12; Florida State - 2013), and another three in the FCS playoffs.

In each of Jenkins' years with B-CU, the Wildcats have ranked among the national FCS leaders for scoring offense, rushing offense, total yardage, total defense and turnover margin, making his teams a formidable force not only in the MEAC, but also in the nation.

In 2013, Brian Jenkins led the Wildcats to their third league title in his four years at the helm in Daytona Beach. The feat would allow the Cats to secure a second consecutive trip to the NCAA FCS Playoffs, matching the school-record of two-straight under former head coach Alvin B. Wyatt, Sr., set in 2002-03. Jenkins would go on to pick up his third MEAC Coach of the Year award, while finishing the year as a finalist for the HBCU National Coach of the Year. The Wildcats finished the season ranked No. 16 in the final *The Sports Network* poll, marking the third-straight year the Cats have finished a season ranked in the national FCS polls. The 16th place ranking was the highest since 2010 when they ranked 15th.

In 2012, he led Bethune-Cookman to its second Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title in his three years with the Maroon and Gold, as well as the second time securing an automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs. The Wildcats would host their opening game for the third time in as many trips to the postseason, welcoming Coastal Carolina to Municipal Stadium on Thanksgiving weekend. In ending the league season with a perfect 8-0 record, Jenkins helped the Cats to their first undefeated MEAC season since 1984. Not only was it the first 8-0 mark in school history within the MEAC, but it was also a school record for conference wins in a single season. For these reasons and more, Jenkins walked away with his second MEAC Coach of the Year award, in addition to claiming FCS Region Two Coach of the Year honors. He concluded the year being tabbed *HBCU Huddle/*

*Sporting News* Coach of the Year, giving him three postseason awards for the first time in his career. Jenkins helped Bethune-Cookman finish the year with a No. 22 Sports Network ranking.

He was the 2010 MEAC Coach of the Year, *SBN Black College* Coach of the Year, AFCA Region Two Coach of the Year, and *BoxToRow/BASN* HBCU Coach of the Year. In addition, the Wildcats claimed their first HBCU National Championship after winning the first 10 games of the year, claiming a share of the MEAC title and appearing in the FCS postseason for the first time since 2003. Jenkins' offense produced a 2,000-yard passer, a pair of 500-yard receivers and another pair of 500-yard rushers. Bethune-Cookman amassed 5,107 yards of offense and scored 457 points - both single season school records.
