STORY LINES

- Bethune-Cookman has a 14-game winning streak against Savannah State, marking the second-longest streak in school history.
 B-CU had a 16-game winning streak against Albany State (1935-1959).
- Senior running back Anthony Jordan eclipsed 1,000 yards in his career last weekend in the win over Howard.
- The Bethune-Cookman offense has racked up at least 400 yards of total offense in each of the Wildcats last three games against Florida Tech, Delaware State and Howard, respectively.
- Bethune-Cookman has the fourth-best rush defense in the FCS. The Cats are allowing just 78.8 yards per game on the ground, while just two opponents (UCF and Florida Tech) have eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark against them all season.
- The Wildcats' 2014 non-conference opponents have posted an overall record of 14-11 on the year, with UCF and Grambling State combining for a perfect 6-0 mark since their games against B-CU.
- In 2014, 15 different Bethune-Cookman players have caught at least one pass for the Wildcats.

- 1. Head coach Brian Jenkins owns a record of 30-4 in Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference play, and owns a record of 3-0 all-time against teams from the state of Georgia.
- 2. Two players have tallied interceptions this season for the Wildcats, with safety Ty're Simmons and cornerback Thomas Finnie.
- 3. B-CU has forced three or more turnovers in 30 games under head coach Brian Jenkins
- 4. The B-CU rushing defense is ranked number four in the nation, allowing just 78.8 yards per game.
- 5. Five B-CU receivers have recorded 100 yards receiving or more on the campaign, led by Frank Brown with 226.

#OCTOBERFEST

- Since the 2000 season, Bethune-Cookman holds a record of 40-13 in the month of October.
- With the Wildcats generally having their BYE week in October during previous seasons, most October's consisted of two or three games maximum.
- Only four coaches have had multi-year spans in which they were undefeated in October:

Brian Jenkins - 2010, 2012, 2013 Bobby Frazier - 1980, 1981 Jack "Cy" McClairen - 1967, 1971 Joe Johnson - 1944, 1946

· Senior receiver Jhomo Gordon leads the Bethune-Cookman receiving core with 19 receptions for 212 yards and two touchdowns. The Palm Bay, Florida native is averaging 11.2 yards per catch, with an average of 35.3 yards per game.

#PROCATS

- Bethune-Cookman has three active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the opening of the 2014 season.
- Ryan Davis (Jacksonville Jaguars), Rashean Mathis (Detroit Lions) and Eric Weems (Atlanta Falcons) are all participating for their respected teams.
- Davis has been a mainstay along the Jaguars' defensive line, registering three sacks and recovering a fumble so far on the year.







SCORING STREAK

Bethune-Cookman has played 88 consecutive games without being shutout - the longest active streak in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. The last time the Wildcats were blanked came Nov. 11, 2006 — a 28-0 loss at Howard. Bethune-Cookman hasn't been shutout at home since Nov. 8, 1997 - a 27.0loss to #9 Hampton.



CIRCLE THESE GUYS...



- Senior running back Cary White has registered 112 yards rushing on just 16 carries this season.
- He sits second on the team in yards per carry, averaging 7.0 yards.
- · White is one of four running backs to have recorded a catch out of the backfield with an 11 yard gain last weekend against Howard.
- · Tallied a season-high 57 yards on six carries, including a 46-yard burst, in the victory over Florida
- Produced his first touchdown of the season on the strength of a 19-yard scamper in the first quarter against Howard.



- . Senior corner back Thomas Finnie registered his first interception as a Wildcat in the 2014 homeopener against Grambling State.
- . Sits third on the Bethune-Cookman squad with 26 tackles on the campaign - 18 coming by way of a solo performance.
- · Played and started in all six games of the season thus far at either the left or right cornerback
- Tallied two tackles for loss and three pass breakups on the year, putting him tied for the third-most deflections on the defensive unit.

#SackLunch

Through the first three games of the 2014 season, the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats have registered 15 quarterback sacks by five different players, averaging 2.5 sacks per game. Last season, the Wildcats recorded 26 sacks by 11 different players in 13 games (an average of 2.0 per game).

































A WIN OVER SAVANNAH STATE WOULD...

- Allow B-CU its 15th consecutive win against the Tigers, one shy a school-record for consecutive wins against any one opponent.
- Give Bethune-Cookman its 23rd win as a ranked team under Brian Jenkins.
- Improve Bethune-Cookman to 2-1 on the road in 2014.
- Bump B-CU's to 196-131-13 all-time in the month of October.
- Give Bethune-Cookman a win in its 797th game all-time in school history.

A QUICK LOOK AT SAVANNAH STATE...

- · Savannah State enters the weekend on a 15-game losing skid dating back to last year.
- The Tigers use the pass as their primary offensive attack, led by a trio of quarterbacks similar to Bethune-Cookman under Brian Jenkins in years past. Tino Smith leads the group with 492 yards on 55-of-98 passing with three interceptions. He has connected twice for touchdowns, both the receiver Cantrell Frazier.
- . Opponents are averaging 239.8 yards per game on the ground against the Tigers defense, while accounting for an average of 440 yards per game of total offense.
- Marguis Smith leads the Tigers defense with 39 tackles, six of those by way of quarterback sack. He is followed up by Justin Dixon with 36 tackles and an interception, with two tackles for loss.

JORDAN TOPS 1,000...

 Senior running back Anthony Jordan topped 1,000 career rushing yards last weekend, on the strength of a 102-yard performance against Howard. The Atlanta, Georgia native has battled injuries throughout his career with the Maroon and Gold, but has been a mainstay in the offensive backfield for the Cats the last two years.

GOT A "Q", GET AN ANSWER...

- Senior quarterback Quentin Williams had his string of 124 consecutive passes without an interception streak snapped last weekend against Delaware State.
- The Tampa native is enjoying one of his best years under center for the Cats. He sits 13th in the nation for passing efficiency, using a 149.2 rating. He ranks 35th nationally for passing yards per completion (12.67 y/c).

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?...

- · Sophomore wide receiver Frank Brown has quickly become a scoring threat receiver for the Wildcats. He leads all B-CU receivers with 228 yards and three touchdowns on just nine receptions.
- . Brown is tied for 40th in the FCS with three receiving touchdowns on the 2014 campaign.
- Brown's first collegiate reception was a 55-yard touchdown pass from Quentin Williams in the victory at FIU.

• Bethune-Cookman holds an all-time record of 195-131-13 in the month of October, dating back to 1925.

- · The Speedway Offense has been a staple under head coach Brian Jenkins since his arrival in Daytona Beach back in 2010. This season, the Wildcats have 12 "lightning strikes" with scoring drives that have lasted three minutes or less.

WHAT'S MY LINE?...

- The defensive line has been a staple of the defense for the Wildcats so far this season. Under the direction of Earl Lane, the defensive linemen have been getting to opposing quarterbacks with ease.
- Defensive ends Erik Williams and LeBranden Richardson have tallied 10 of the team's 15 total quarterback sacks.
- Redshirt senior LeBranden Richardson is tied for 11th nationally in sacks, averaging 1.00 per game.

STARTING FAST...

- In each of the last three games, Bethune-Cookman has scored on its opening offensive possession to take the
- The Wildcats are 32-2 under head coach Brian Jenkins when scoring first.

DON'T BE IN A RUSH...

- . Bethune-Cookman's rushing defense has been one of the best in the nation, statistically, under defensive coordinator Charles "Yogi" Jones for the past three years. This season appears to be no different.
- The Wildcats are ranked fourth nationally (tops in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference) in rushing defense, allowing just 78 yards per game.

DON'T GET LOST...

• The defensive pressure for Bethune-Cookman has been turned all the way up this season. The Wildcats have amassed 48 tackles for loss, totaling 146 yards so far through the first six games. That ranks the Cats second in the MEAC, as well as 21st nationally in that department.

RUSHING TO A CONCLUSION...

- . Redshirt sophomore running back Danny Dillard saw his first action of the season two weeks again at home against Grambling State. The University of Miami transfer picked up 55 yards on eight carries, rushing into the end zone one as well.

PLAY MAKING DEFENSE...

The Wildcats lead the league with 64 takeaways over the course of the last 28 games.

JENKINS AT MUNICIPAL STADIUM...

• Head coach Brian Jenkins made his sideline debut at Municipal Stadium Sept. 4, 2010 (W, 70-10 vs. Edward Waters) after spending the prior season calling plays from the booth high above as Rutgers' wide receivers coach. Since Jenkins' arrival in 2010, the Wildcats are 22-5 at Municipal Stadium, averaging 34.21 points per game at home. Of the five losses at Municipal Stadium under Jenkins, two were post-season contests in the FCS Playoffs (2010 - vs. New Hampshire; 2012 - vs. Coastal Carolina).

BRIAN JENKINS

Head Coach, Fifth Season Cincinnati, 1993

In just four years at the helm, Jenkins' 37-11 (.771) overall record stands as the best four-year performance of any coach to walk the B-CUsidelines. In fact, his 28-4 record in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference is unmatched by any coach beginning a four-year stretch at an MEAC institution. In 2012, he rushed his record to 27-8. Only B-CU Hall of Famer Charles W. Moore (with 27 wins) had as many victories in his first three years as a Wildcat head coach. In fact, his record from 2010-12 was the best of any Division I coach in the state of Florida in that span.

Of all the hires in the 2010 FCS class, Jenkins ranks first in winning percentage and third for wins amongst that class of coaching hires Only Willie Fritz (Sam Houston) and Jeff Monken (Georgia Southern) have claimed more wins in the last three seasons. In 2013, Jenkins posted one of the biggest wins in both B-CU and MEAC history when the Wildcats defeated their first FBS opponent in the form of Florida International University (FIU) on the road in Miami. It was the first win for an MEAC school over an FBS opponent since Delaware State took down Akron in 1987, and just the fifth time in history an HBCU had defeated an FBS opponent. Other signature wins include at eventual MEAC Champion Norfolk State in 2011, and three consecutive wins against rival Florida A&M (2011-13). He also collected a key road win at Tennessee State in the John Merritt Classic (2013), in addition to South Carolina State (2012). Three of Jenkins' losses in his career have come to BCS opponents (Miami - 2011, '12; Florida State - 2013), and another three in the FCS

In each of Jenkins' years with B-CU, the Wildcats have ranked among the national FCS leaders for scoring offense, rushing offense, total yardage, total defense and turnover margin, making his teams a formidable force not only in the MEAC, but also in the nation.

In 2013, Brian Jenkins led the Wildcats to their third league title in his four years at the helm in Daytona Beach. The feat would allow the Cats to secure a second consecutive trip to the NCAA FCS Playoffs, matching the school-record of two-straight under former head coach Alvin B. Wyatt, Sr., set in 2002-03. Jenkins would go on to pick up his third MEAC Coach of the Year award, while finishing the year as a finalist for the HBCU National Coach of the Year. The Wildcats finished the season ranked No. 16 in the final *The Sports Network* poll, marking the third-straight year the Cats have finished a season ranked in the national FCS polls. The 16th place ranking was the highest since 2010 when they ranked 15th.

In 2012, he led Bethune-Cookman to its second Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title in his three years with the Maroon and Gold, as well as the second time securing an automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs. The Wildcats would host their opening game for the third time in as many trips to the postseason, welcoming Coastal Carolina to Municipal Stadium on Thanksgiving weekend. In ending the league season with a perfect 8-0 record, Jenkins helped the Cats to their first undefeated MEAC season since 1984. Not only was it the first 8-0 mark in school history within the MEAC, but it was also a school record for conference wins in a single season. For these reasons and more, Jenkins walked away with his second MEAC Coach of the Year award, in addition to claiming FCS Region Two Coach of the Year honors. He concluded the year being tabbed HBCU Huddle/

Sporting News Coach of the Year, giving him three postseason awards for the first time in his career. Jenkins helped Bethune-Cookman finish the year with a No. 22 Sports Network ranking.

He was the 2010 MEAC Coach of the Year, SBN Black College Coach of the Year, AFCA Region Two Coach of the Year, and BoxToRow/BASN HBCU Coach of the Year. In addition, the Wildcats claimed their first HBCU National Championship after winning the first 10 games of the year, claiming a share of the MEAC title and appearing in the FCS postseason for the first time since 2003. Jenkins' offense produced a 2,000-yard passer, a pair of 500-yard receivers and another paid of 500-yard rushers. Bethune-Cookman amassed 5,107 yards of offense and scored 457 points - both single season school records.
