STORY LINES

- Redshirt senior quarterback Quentin Williams is ranked fifth nationally in the FCS for passing efficiency (173.2), as well as 34th nationally in passing yards (1,594). He is tied for 23rd in passing touchdowns (13).
- Bethune-Cookman head coach Terry Sims and the team have honored the rest of the season to two B-CU students who's lives were taken from them — Timesha Floyd Carswell and Diona McDonald.
- Having lost to North Carolina A&T on Oct. 17, Bethune-Cookman bounced back for a 59-49 win over Norfolk State last weekend. B-CU has not dropped back-to-back games since 2012 (at Miami, vs. Tennessee State). In fact, the Cats have not dropped consecutive league games since the end of the 2010 season (vs. FAMU) and beginning of 2011 (vs. S.C. State).
- Bethune-Cookman has three fourth quarter come-from-behind wins this year at Grambling State, at North Carolina Central and versus South Carolina State, respectfully.
- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 43-15 in the month of October.

#5THINGS

1. Redshirt senior quarterback Quentin Williams is ranked fifth in the nation for passing efficiency (173.2).
2. Graduate running back Anthony Jordan needs just 47 yards to move into the top 10 all-time at B-CU for career rushing yards.
3. Bethune-Cookman is 2-2 in its last four trips to Dover, Delaware, but the Cats have won the last two games consecutively.
4. Redshirt sophomore receiver Jawill Davis is second in the MEAC with 69.6 yards per game, having hauled in 557 yards on a team-leading 27 receptions.
5. Bethune-Cookman is atop the league stats for total offense, with the Wildcats producing an average of 420.5 yards per game.



#LIGHTNINGSTRIKE

- Bethune-Cookman head coach Terry Sims and Offensive Coordinator Jim Pry have continued the upbeat pace of the Wildcats offense.
- Drives that consist of three minutes (3:00) or less are called "Lightning Strikes", with the quick pace of the offense striking fast like lightning.
- Of the 30 drives that B-CU has scored touchdowns on this season, 25 took less than three minutes off the clock. In fact, 13 of those drives have taken less than two minutes off the clock.

#OCTOBERFEST

- The month of October has been a scary month for the opposition throughout the last 15 years of B-CU Football.
- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 43-15 in the Halloween month, including perfect marks in 2002 (3-0), 2010 (5-0), 2012 (3-0) and 2013 (4-0).
- Six of the 15 losses occurred away from home.

- Bethune-Cookman's second-ever Thursday night football game on ESPN2 took place in Dover, Delaware during the 2007 season. That same year, DSU won the MEAC title.

- Allow B-CU to stay within a game of the top spot in the MEAC.
- Assure Terry Sims a winning season, regardless of postseason play.
- Give B-CU its 480 victory all-time in school history.

SERIES NOTES...

- Delaware State leads the all-time series against Bethune-Cookman, 20-17.
- The Hornets hold an all-time home record of 12-5 at Alumni Stadium against the Wildcats. However, Bethune-Cookman has won the last two consecutive trips to Dover, Delaware.
- Bethune-Cookman trailed early two seasons ago in Delaware, before the Cats bounced back for a hard-fought 21-7 decision.
- A win against the Hornets would allow B-CU to tie its longest win streak against the Hornets which was five games from 2000-04.

HIGH FIVE FOR DAVIS...

- Redshirt sophomore WR Jawill Davis registered a game-high 199 receiving yards in the win at Grambling State on Sept. 12. That yardage placed him fifth all-time in the B-CU record books for single game receiving yards.

A MOMENT OF SILENCE...

- The Bethune-Cookman Athletics family lost two former Wildcats just over two weeks ago in the form of former equipment manager and teacher Art Parissi, as well as former punter Zach Adrian.
- Zach was apunter for the Wildcats from 1998-2001, where he averaged 35.7 yards a punt on 53 kicks.
- His father, Pete Adrian – a former Bethune-Cookman defensive coordinator and Norfolk State University head coach, informed B-CU Athletics that Zach, after enduring over 300 chemotherapies, 32 radiation treatments and major surgeries on his hip and femur, passed peacefully while surrounded by family at Halifax Hospice of Volusia County.

THAT'S THE WAY IT IS...

- After B-CU defeated South Carolina State in an ESPNU Thursday night broadcast at Municipal Stadium last Thursday, it was announced this week that redshirt senior LB Robert Way was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Week.
- Against South Carolina State, Robert Way sparked the Bethune-Cookman defense in yet another come-from-behind win for the Wildcats over the Bulldogs in a game televised on ESPNU in Thursday night football. Way supplied a team-high 13 tackles, four by way of primary stops, adding a tackle for loss. He also deflected a pass over the middle, and forced a fumble.

- Despite the announcement of the Celebration Bowl, a member of the MEAC still has the possibility of participating in the FCS Playoffs. A member would have to accept an at-large bid to the playoffs, which last happened with South Carolina State accepting the at-large bid in 2013.
- That same year, #12 Bethune-Cookman earned the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs before falling at #11 Coastal Carolina in the opening round.

CONFERENCE MISSES...

- Bethune-Cookman's two conference "misses" in 2015 are Hampton and Howard. This will mark the first time since 1994 that B-CU is not facing the Hampton Pirates – that was a season prior to Hampton becoming a member of the MEAC. The Cats did not face the Bison of Howard in 2011 nor 2012.

LAST YEAR...

- B-CU went 9-3 in 2014 (6-2 MEAC), claiming a share of the school's third consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship. One of the biggest moments of the year was the season-opening victory at FIU, marking the second time in as many years the Wildcats registered a victory over an FBS opponent. B-CU ended the season with a victory over rival Florida A&M in the annual *Florida Blue Florida Classic* at the Orlando Citrus Bowl Stadium, giving the Cats their school-record fourth consecutive win over their conference foes from Tallahassee.

2015 SCHEDULE...

- Bethune-Cookman's 2015 football schedule, with five home games at Municipal Stadium aka "The Cage", features four nationally-televvised contests. The slate also sees a season-opener at ACC opponent Miami, before traveling to SWAC member Grambling State for the return of a home-and-home series with the Tigers that began a season ago in Daytona Beach. The home-opener against Lane (Sept. 19) serves as Church & Community Day, with B-CU returning home the following week in the league opening game against Savannah State (Sept. 26). NOTIN' THE OPPONENT: DELAWARE STATE UNIVERSITY FLAG DAY

• Delaware State will have to come-from-behind to maintain its recent standard as the MEAC's least penalized team. The Hornets are currently seventh in the MEAC with 79.1 penalty yards per game. DSU is sixth in the league for most flags with 64. The Hornets have been the MEAC's least penalized team in four of the last five seasons. In 2014, DSU committed 71 committed penalties for 575 yards in 12 games, fewest in the league in each category. DSU did not commit a single penalty in its 2014 season opening loss to Monmouth, marking the first time in recorded team history that the Hornets were not assessed a penalty in a game.

STAYING HOME

• Delaware State's 2015 roster includes a total of 20 in-state players, tops among the states. The Hornets' Delaware products are: Kamal Abrams (Dover), Brycen Alleyne (Wilmington), Sika Bendolph (Dover), Tecumseh Bendolph (Dover), Denzek Burgette (Middletown), Stewart Carey (Newark), Chuka Ezeuzoh (Wilmington), Mark Flakes (Wilmington); Morris Frasier (Felton); Malik Golson (Dover); John Griffin (Middletown), Darren Helwig (Dover); Jamaal Jackson (Wilmington); Keyjuan Selby (Bear), Taronn Selby (Bear); DaShawn Smith (New Castle); Kyle Taylor (Wilmington), Ameer Watson (Smyrna); Logan Wescott (Bridgeville); and Eric Wright (Bear). • DSU's is tops in the MEAC (61st in FCS) in net punting at 35.06. The Hornets are trying to snap an overall 12-game losing streak (last win Oct. 11, 2014, at Norfolk State).

• First-year DB Logan Wescott is making the most of his playing opportunities. Wescott, a walk-on from Delaware's Woodbridge High School, has started at free safety in four games this season due to an injury to veteran Kevin Jocelyn. On Oct. 10 at Hampton, Wescott had three solo tackles and an assist, along with an interception and 72-yard return. The return on his first career pick was the longest by a Hornet since Nick Williams ran 79 yards for a touchdown vs. Howard in 2012. Wescott has appeared in all seven games this season, recording 17 tackles, in-cluding 11 unassisted.

• Hornet wide receiver Aris Scott (jr.) is living up to his preseason expectations the last three games. Scott had eight catches for 87 yards vs. SC State last week. The previous week at Florida A&M, he 12 receptions, one shy of the Hornets' single-game record. He had seven catches for 140 yards (long 36), each a career-high, vs. Hampton on Oct. 10. The receiving yards at Hampton were the most by a DSU receiver since Milton Williams III had 179 vs. Morgan State in 2013. For the season, Scott has 32 catches for a team-high 425 yards this season, although he has yet to catch a touchdown pass. Entering his week's games, he ranks third in the MEAC in receptions (4.6 pg), and fifth in receiving yards (425) and receiving yards per game (60.7).

• For the first time in more than 30 years, there's a major new look to the helmets worn by the Hornets. The familiar "State" logo on each side of the helmet has been replaced by the Hornet logo on the left and the player's number on the right.

TERRY SIMS

**Head Coach, First Season
Knoxville, 1994**

Terry Sims was introduced as the 15th head coach at Bethune-Cookman University on December 22, 2015. The 43-year old native of Jesup, Georgia took over the program after spending the previous five years as an assistant coach for the Wildcats. While the 2015 season will be his first as head coach, it will be his sixth year overall with the Maroon and Gold of Bethune-Cookman.

Sims is recognized nationally by several collegiate and professional coaches as “a head coach that is just now getting his program”, after being viewed as head coach material for quite some time – though continuing to serve as an assistant. His football knowledge and defensive prowess is unparalleled, and viewed by many as second-to-none. Since his arrival in Daytona Beach back in 2010, the Wildcats defense has consistently ranked in the top 25 statistically in several categories.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position with the Maroon and Gold, Sims served as assistant head coach. He oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the B-CU program, as well as working extensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick Addison.

In 2014, B-CU once again captured no less than a share of the school’s seventh MEAC crown all-time, as well as the fourth title in the last five seasons. Once again, the defensive side of the ball was a huge part of that success, as they finished in the top three of several categories in the league, as well as nationally.

The defensive unit finished atop the FCS for total defense and rush defense. The Cats allowed just 237.5 yards per game to their opposition, while also allowing just 79.9 yards per game on the ground. The team would go on to finish second in the FCS for first downs defense, and seventh nationally in passing yards allowed (157.6 p/g).

During the 2013 campaign, the B-CU secondary once again caused havoc amongst opposing offenses around the MEAC and nation alike. In all, 14 of the team’s 19 interceptions were recorded by the secondary, including a team-high five by safety Nick Addison. The unit finished third in the MEAC for pass defense, allowing just 149.2 yards per game through the air. The Wildcats finished second in the league for interceptions, grabbing 19 and returning three for scores. That number allowed them to finish tied for fifth nationally for passes intercepted, and on the third-fewest passes attempted (326) among the top 20 team for that category.

In 2012, the Wildcats stood as the third-best team in the nation for passes intercepted, bringing down 20 on the campaign. They also improved a spot from 12th in passing defense in 2011, up to 11th in 2012. The Cats’ 20 interceptions also ranked as the most for any team sitting in the top 25 for passing defense overall. In passing efficiency defense, the Wildcats were second in the nation. For scoring defense, Bethune-Cookman not only finished second in the MEAC, but 10th nationally.

In capturing their second MEAC crown in three years, the Wildcats defense helped limit the opposition all season long in 2012. As a unit, the Cats finished second in scoring defense in the league, in addition to third in total defense. Since his arrival, the B-CU defense has finished no lower than fourth in the league in those categories.

In takeaways, the B-CU defense sat atop the league with +18 in turnover margin. That comes on the heels of the team finishing atop the league in red zone defense. That was up a space from 2011 where they finished the season second in the league.

During the 2011 campaign, the Wildcats improved nationally to 14th in the NCAA FCS in pass defense, holding opponents to just 174.5 yards passing per game.

Sims aided Bethune-Cookman in reaching fourth in the final NCAA FCS rankings for pass efficiency defense (93.97) in 2010, in addition to ranking 25th nationally in pass defense (174.92 YPG). His defensive backs combined for 13 interceptions, making a big contribution to B-CU’s number one ranking in the NCAA for turnover margin.

Before arriving in Daytona Beach, Sims spent four seasons as recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at Howard University. Prior to moving into the MEAC, Sims coached cornerbacks at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette for two seasons, working to improve passing coverage, and aiding the Ragin’ Cajuns in attaining top-25 national pass defense rankings.

An experienced coach with ties to Texas and the Mid-Atlantic region, Sims previously served in the secondary at Prairie View A&M. While working with the Panthers, Sims coached the defensive backs, in addition to kick returners. He was also in charge of breaking down film and preparing opponent scouting reports. Additionally, he was active in the planning of recruiting weekends, organizing on-and-off campus recruiting, while serving the role of academic and compliance liaison.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University in Houston, also serving as the assistant head coach for three seasons and was recruiting and video coordinator.

During his four-year term with the Tigers, Sims coached some of the top defensive backs in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, including Santino Hall, who finished the 2001 season leading the conference in pass breakups with 20, and Oliver Celestine, who led TSU in interceptions and broke the school record for yards on an interception return. Both players went on to play professionally (Celestine: NY Jets, Hall: Saskatchewan Roughriders).

Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peay for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAfee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master’s Degree from Louisville in 1997. A native of Jesup, Ga., Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra, and son Xavier.
