STORY LINES

- Bethune-Cookman has won four consecutive games against Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) opponents, including a win over Grambling State a season ago in Daytona Beach. B-CU has also defeated Prairie View A&M (2011) and Alabama State (2012) in the *Walt Disney World MEAC/SWAC Challenge*.
- This weekend marks Bethune-Cookman's first trip to Grambling State since 1987, a contest in which the Wildcats fell to the Tigers by a count of 21-14.
- The Wildcats have not won a game in the state of Louisiana since defeating Xavier (La.) in 1956.
- Despite having a first-year head coach, Bethune-Cookman's offensive and defensive coordinators are the same with Charles "Yogi" Jones (defense) and Jim Pry (offense) at the helm.
- Picking up a fumble against the Hurricanes last weekend, Bethune-Cookman has not forced a turnover in three consecutive games — as well as seven of the last eight dating back to last season.

#5THINGS

1. Head Coach Terry Sims is seeking his first win as a collegiate head coach for Bethune-Cookman, dropping his debut contest at Miami a week ago.
2. The Wildcats have just two (2) wins all-time against Grambling State, one coming a season ago in Daytona Beach.
3. Running back Jamaruz Thompkins led the B-CU ground game against Miami, registering 14 yards on three rushes.
4. Playing in his first game in the Maroon and Gold, Diquan Richardson posted four solo tackles, adding an assisted stop for five total tackles against the Miami Hurricanes.
5. Bethune-Cookman has travelled to Grambling State five times previously, dropping all of the prior games by an average of 11.6 points per game.



#SPEEDWAYOFFENSE

- In 2010, Bethune-Cookman unveiled the "Speedway Offense". This season, Terry Sims and Jim Pry (offensive coordinator) are returning to the "Speedway" style, after it was transformed into a little slower pace from 2011-14.
- In 2014, Bethune-Cookman tallied 10 scoring drives in which the Wildcats had three plays or less.
- In all but three games last season, the Wildcats registered a scoring drive with three plays or less. Two of those games without were against FBS opponents FIU and UCF, respectively.
- The average scoring drive for Bethune-Cookman the past two seasons has taken just 3:29 off the clock.

#NEWLOOK

- With Head Coach Terry Sims taking over the reigns of the Bethune-Cookman program, the Wildcats will have a fresh new look as far as helmet decals are concerned in 2015. B-CU will use the new "BC" interlocking logo for the Miami game, with other decals to be announced week-by-week.

#PROCATS

- Bethune-Cookman has three active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the opening of the 2015 season.
- Ryan Davis (Jacksonville Jaguars), Rashean Mathis (Detroit Lions) and Eric Weems (Atlanta Falcons) are all participating for their respected teams.
- Jean Fanor and Tavarus Dantzler are both current members of the practice squad for the Green Bay Packers.



CIRCLE THIS GUY...



- Redshirt freshman corner James Darby II saw action in his first-ever collegiate game at Miami, making the start in the process against the Hurricanes.
- Darby, a product of Booker T. Washington HS in Miami, was faced with a tall task of trying to stop a speedy Hurricanes receiving core, and the likes of All-America quarterback Brad Kaaya.
- He registered two total tackles, including a solo tackle for loss on a rush to the outside.

FUN FACT I

- Bethune-Cookman is opening the season with back-to-back road games. The last time the Cats opened the year with consecutive road games was 2012, when they started with three consecutive games away from municipal Stadium (vs. Alabama State – Orlando; at South Carolina State; at Miami).

FUN FACT II

- B-CU head coach Terry Sims used to serve as an assistant coach at two SWAC member institutions - Texas Southern and Prairie View A&M. B-CU assistant coach Darrin Hayes used to serve as defensive coordinator at Mississippi Valley State and Jackson State.

FUN FACT III

- Bethune-Cookman does not have a player on the current roster from the Pelican State of Louisiana.

A WIN OVER GRAMBLING STATE WOULD...

- Give Bethune-Cookman its fifth consecutive win over an opponent from the SWAC.
- Give Terry Sims his first win as head coach of the Wildcats.
- Allow B-CU consecutive wins over Grambling State for the first time in school history.
- Give B-CU its first win in the state of Louisiana since 1956 – vs. Xavier (La.).

SERIES NOTES...

- Grambling State holds a commanding 11-2 advantage all-time in the series against B-CU.
- Bethune-Cookman ended an eight-game losing skid to the Tigers last year via a 36-23 decision over Grambling State at Municipal Stadium in Daytona Beach, Florida.
- In 2014, Bethune-Cookman scored the game's final 14 points in the fourth quarter, erasing a 23-22 deficit for the come-from-behind victory.

IT WAS SEPTEMBER...

- Bethune-Cookman owns an all-time record of 111-71-2 in games played during the month of September.
- Last season, the Cats went 2-1, with their lone loss being a setback to FBS opponent UCF in Orlando.
- Since 2012, B-CU has lost just one game in September to an opponent from an FCS conference – that being a 21-14 setback at home to Tennessee State (Sept. 22, 2012).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS...

- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman is 33-11 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State, FIU (x2) and Tennessee State. During that stretch, the Wildcats are 7-2 against teams from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC), including winning the last four consecutive against the fellow HBCU Division I conference.
- Of the 11 losses in non-conference play, five have come against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), including Florida State, Miami (x3) and UCF.

#CELEBRATIONBOWL

- It was announced in March that the champion of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) will not participate in the FCS Playoffs, as the league relinquished its automatic bid to the playoffs.
- The MEAC champion will meet the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) champion in Atlanta's Georgia Dome in the inaugural Celebration Bowl on December 19, 2015.

PLAYOFFS???

- Despite the announcement of the Celebration Bowl, a member of the MEAC still has the possibility of participating in the FCS Playoffs. A member would have to accept an at-large bid to the playoffs, which last happened with South Carolina State accepting the at-large bid in 2013.
- That same year, #12 Bethune-Cookman earned the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs before falling at #11 Coastal Carolina in the opening round.

CARTER BACK FROM INJURY...

- After suffering a season-ending injury to his wrist prior to the start of the 2014 campaign, wide receiver redshirt junior **Jontavious Carter** is returning the B-CU lineup. Against Miami, he picked up his first starting job since the 2013 campaign.
- In his first season with the Maroon and Gold in 2013, Carter finished third on the team with 310 receiving yards and two touchdowns.

- Bethune-Cookman's two conference "misses" in 2015 are Hampton and Howard. This will mark the first time since 1994 that B-CU is not facing the Hampton Pirates – that was a season prior to Hampton becoming a member of the MEAC. The Cats did not face the Bison of Howard in 2011 nor 2012.

THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL...

- It was announced over the summer that Bethune-Cookman's home game against South Carolina State will be broadcast live on Thursday night, giving the Cats a Thursday night game for the third time in the last two seasons.
- Since the agreement with ESPN was put in place for the MEAC in 2005, the Wildcats have

- B-CU went 9-3 in 2014 (6-2 MEAC), claiming a share of the school's third consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship. One of the biggest moments of the year was the season-opening victory at FIU, marking the second time in as many years the Wildcats registered a victory over an FBS opponent. B-CU ended the season with a victory over rival Florida A&M in the annual *Florida Blue Florida Classic* at the Orlando Citrus Bowl Stadium, giving the Cats their school-record fourth consecutive win over their conference foes from Tallahassee.

2015 SCHEDULE...

- Bethune-Cookman's 2015 football schedule, with five home games at Municipal Stadium aka "The Cage", features four nationally-televised contests. The slate also sees a season-opener at ACC opponent Miami, before traveling to SWAC member Grambling State for the return of a home-and-home series with the Tigers that began a season ago in Daytona Beach. The home-opener against Lane (Sept. 19) serves as Church & Community Day, with B-CU returning home the following week in the league opening game against Savannah State (Sept. 26). TERRY SIMS

**Head Coach, First Season
Knoxville, 1994**

Terry Sims was introduced as the 15th head coach at Bethune-Cookman University on December 22, 2015. The 43-year old native of Jesup, Georgia took over the program after spending the previous five years as an assistant coach for the Wildcats. While the 2015 season will be his first as head coach, it will be his sixth year overall with the Maroon and Gold of Bethune-Cookman.

Sims is recognized nationally by several collegiate and professional coaches as “a head coach that is just now getting his program”, after being viewed as head coach material for quite some time – though continuing to serve as an assistant. His football knowledge and defensive prowess is unparalleled, and viewed by many as second-to-none. Since his arrival in Daytona Beach back in 2010, the Wildcats defense has consistently ranked in the top 25 statistically in several categories.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position with the Maroon and Gold, Sims served as assistant head coach. He oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the B-CU program, as well as working extensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick Addison.

In 2014, B-CU once again captured no less than a share of the school’s seventh MEAC crown all-time, as well as the fourth title in the last five seasons. Once again, the defensive side of the ball was a huge part of that success, as they finished in the top three of several categories in the league, as well as nationally.

The defensive unit finished atop the FCS for total defense and rush defense. The Cats allowed just 237.5 yards per game to their opposition, while also allowing just 79.9 yards per game on the ground. The team would go on to finish second in the FCS for first downs defense, and seventh nationally in passing yards allowed (157.6 p/g).

During the 2013 campaign, the B-CU secondary once again caused havoc amongst opposing offenses around the MEAC and nation alike. In all, 14 of the team’s 19 interceptions were recorded by the secondary, including a team-high five by safety Nick Addison. The unit finished third in the MEAC for pass defense, allowing just 149.2 yards per game through the air. The Wildcats finished second in the league for interceptions, grabbing 19 and returning three for scores. That number allowed them to finish tied for fifth nationally for passes intercepted, and on the third-fewest passes attempted (326) among the top 20 team for that category.

In 2012, the Wildcats stood as the third-best team in the nation for passes intercepted, bringing down 20 on the campaign. They also improved a spot from 12th in passing defense in 2011, up to 11th in 2012. The Cats’ 20 interceptions also ranked as the most for any team sitting in the top 25 for passing defense overall. In passing efficiency defense, the Wildcats were second in the nation. For scoring defense, Bethune-Cookman not only finished second in the MEAC, but 10th nationally.

In capturing their second MEAC crown in three years, the Wildcats defense helped limit the opposition all season long in 2012. As a unit, the Cats finished second in scoring defense in the league, in addition to third in total defense. Since his arrival, the B-CU defense has finished no lower than fourth in the league in those categories.

In takeaways, the B-CU defense sat atop the league with +18 in turnover margin. That comes on the heels of the team finishing atop the league in red zone defense. That was up a space from 2011 where they finished the season second in the league.

During the 2011 campaign, the Wildcats improved nationally to 14th in the NCAA FCS in pass defense, holding opponents to just 174.5 yards passing per game.

Sims aided Bethune-Cookman in reaching fourth in the final NCAA FCS rankings for pass efficiency defense (93.97) in 2010, in addition to ranking 25th nationally in pass defense (174.92 YPG). His defensive backs combined for 13 interceptions, making a big contribution to B-CU’s number one ranking in the NCAA for turnover margin.

Before arriving in Daytona Beach, Sims spent four seasons as recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at Howard University. Prior to moving into the MEAC, Sims coached cornerbacks at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette for two seasons, working to improve passing coverage, and aiding the Ragin’ Cajuns in attaining top-25 national pass defense rankings.

An experienced coach with ties to Texas and the Mid-Atlantic region, Sims previously served in the secondary at Prairie View A&M. While working with the Panthers, Sims coached the defensive backs, in addition to kick returners. He was also in charge of breaking down film and preparing opponent scouting reports. Additionally, he was active in the planning of recruiting weekends, organizing on-and-off campus recruiting, while serving the role of academic and compliance liaison.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University in Houston, also serving as the assistant head coach for three seasons and was recruiting and video coordinator.

During his four-year term with the Tigers, Sims coached some of the top defensive backs in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, including Santino Hall, who finished the 2001 season leading the conference in pass breakups with 20, and Oliver Celestine, who led TSU in interceptions and broke the school record for yards on an interception return. Both players went on to play professionally (Celestine: NY Jets, Hall: Saskatchewan Roughriders).

Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peay for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAfee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master’s Degree from Louisville in 1997. A native of Jesup, Ga., Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra, and son Xavier.
