 a longtime battle with cancer just a few weeks ago.
- Bethune-Cookman has three fourth quarter come-from-behind wins this year at Grambling State, at North Carolina Central and versus South Carolina State, respectfully.

- 1. Redshirt senior quarterback Quentin Williams is ranked second in the nation for passing efficiency (177.4). He is also 48th in total offense.
- 2. Receivers Frank Brown and Jawill Davis are each tied for 35th nationally for receiving touchdowns.
- 3. Bethune-Cookman and Morgan State are playing each other for the first time since a 2012 affair in Baltimore that saw current head coach Terry Sims assume coaching responsibilities in the second quarter.
- 4. The Wildcats are back in the Coaches' Poll top 25 for the first time since the end of the 2014 season.
- 5. Bethune-Cookman is atop the league stats for total offense, with the Wildcats producing an average of 428.1 vards per game.



#LIGHTNINGSTRIKE

- . Bethune-Cookman head coach Terry Sims and Offensive Coordinator Jim Pry have continued the upbeat pace of the Wildcats offense.
- . Drives that consist of three minutes (3:00) or less are called "Lightning Strikes", with the quick pace of the offense striking fast like lightning.
- Of the 37 drives that B-CU has scored touchdowns on this season, 29 took less than three minutes off the clock. In fact, 14 of those drives have taken less than two minutes off the clock.

#OCTOBERFEST

- · The month of October has been a scary month for the opposition throughout the last 15 years of B-CU Football
- · Since 2000. Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 44-15 in the Halloween month, including perfect marks in 2002 (3-0), 2010 (5-0), 2012 (3-0) and 2013 (4-0).
- Six of the 15 losses occurred away from home.

- . Bethune-Cookman has three active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the opening of the 2015 season.

- . Senior safety Ty're Simmons returned in 2015 as just one of three starters back on the defensive side of the ball from the 2014 campaign.
- Simmons is the twin brother of fellow safety Ky're Simmons - both playing in their last home game in the Maroon and Gold this weekend.
- Simmons isseventh on the Wildcats roster with 27 tackles (10 primary stops), as well as 1.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage and a team-leading two interceptions.

Through nine games in 2015, Bethune-Cookman has accumulated 17 quarterback sacks, averaging 1.89 sacks per game.

- Bethune-Cookman leads the all-time series against Morgan State by a count of 20-7.
- Morgan State has won four times in Daytona Beach, including a 33-7 decisive win on a B-CU Homecoming weekend in Daytona Beach back in 2007.
- The last tiem these two teams met, former head coach Brian Jenkins was ejected in the second quarter, allowing now-head coach Terry Sims his first active collegiate head coaching experience in the Wildcats' win.

HIGH FIVE FOR DAVIS...

 Redshirt sophomore WR Jawill Davis registered a game-high 199 receiving yards in the win at Grambling State on Sept. 12. That yardage placed him fifth all-time in the B-CU record books for single game receiving yards.

A MOMENT OF SILENCE...

- The Bethune-Cookman Athletics family lost two former Wildcats just over two weeks ago in the form of former equipment manager and teacher Art Parissi, as well as former punter Zach Adrian.
- Zach was apunter for the Wildcats from 1998-2001, where he averaged 35.7 yards a punt on 53 kicks.
- His father, Pete Adrian a former Bethune-Cookman defensive coordinator and Norfolk State University head coach, informed B-CU Athletics that Zach, after enduring over 300 chemotherapies, 32 radiation treatments and major surgeries on his hip and femur, passed peacefully while surrounded by family at Halifax Hospice of Volusia County.

THAT'S THE WAY IT IS...

- · After B-CU defeated South Carolina State in an ESPNU Thursday night broadcast at Municipal Stadioum last Thursday, it was announced this week that redshirt senior LB Robert Way was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Week.
- Against South Carolina State, Robert Way sparked the Bethune-Cookman defense in yet another come-frombehind win for the Wildcats over the Bulldogs in a game televised on ESPNU in Thursday night football. Way supplied a team-high 13 tackles, four by way of primary stops, adding a tackle for loss. He also deflected a pass over the middle, and forced a fumble.

- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman is 35-11 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State, FIU (x2) and Tennessee State. During that stretch, the Wildcats are 7-2 against teams from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC), including winning the last four consecutive against the fellow HBCU Division I conference.
- Of the 11 losses in non-conference play, five have come against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), including Florida State, Miami (x3) and UCF.



. B-CU went 9-3 in 2014 (6-2 MEAC), claiming a share of the school's third consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship. One of the biggest moments of the year was the season-opening victory at FIU, marking the second time in as many years the Wildcats registered a victory over an FBS opponent. B-CU ended the season with a victory over rival Florida A&M in the annual Florida Blue Florida Classic at the Orlando Citrus Bowl Stadium, giving the Cats their school-record fourth consecutive win over their conference foes from Tallahassee.

TERRY SIMS

Head Coach, First Season Knoxville, 1994

Terry Sims was introduced as the 15th head coach at Bethune-Cookman University on December 22, 2015. The 43-year old native of Jesup, Georgia took over the program after spending the previous five years as an assistant coach for the Wildcats. While the 2015 season will be his first as head coach, it will be his sixth year overall with the Maroon and Gold of Bethune-Cookman.

Sims is recognized nationally by several collegiate and professional coaches as "a head coach that is just now getting his program", after being viewed as head coach material for quite some time - though continuing to serve as an assistant. His football knowledge and defensive prowess is unparalleled, and viewed by many as secondto-none. Since his arrival in Daytona Beach back in 2010, the Wildcats defense has consistently ranked in the top 25 statistically in several categories.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position with the Maroon and Gold, Sims served as assistant head coach. He oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the B-CU program, as well as working ext5ensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick

In 2014, B-CU once again captured no less than a share of the school's seventh MEAC crown all-time, as well as the fourth title in the last five seasons. Once again, the defensive side of the ball was a huge part of that success, as they finished in the top three of several categories in the league, as well as nationally.

The defensive unit finished atop the FCS for total defense and rush defense. The Cats allowed just 237.5 yards per game to their opposition, while also allowing just 79.9 yards per game on the ground. The team would go on to finish second in the FCS for first downs defense, and seventh nationally in passing yards allowed (157.6 p/g).

During the 2013 campaign, the B-CU secondary once again caused havoc amongst opposing offenses around the MEAC and nation alike. In all, 14 of the team's 19 interceptions were recorded by the secondary, including a team-high five by safety Nick Addison. The unit finished third in the MEAC for pass defense, allowing just 149.2 yards per game through the air. The Wildcats finished second in the league for interceptions, grabbing 19 and returning three for scores. That number allowed them to finish tied for fifth nationally for passes intercepted, and on the third-fewest passes attempted (326) among the top 20 team for that category.

In 2012, the Wildcats stood as the third-best team in the nation for passes intercepted, bringing down 20 on the campaign. They also improved a spot from 12th in passing defense in 2011, up to 11th in 2012. The Cats' 20 interceptions also ranked as the most for any team sitting in the top 25 for passing defense overall. In passing efficiency defense, the Wildcats were second in the nation. For scoring defense, Bethune-Cookman not only finished second in the MEAC, but 10th nationally.

In capturing their second MEAC crown in three years, the Wildcats defense helped limit the opposition all season long in 2012. As a unit, the Cats finished second in scoring defense in the league, in addition to third in total defense. Since his arrival, the B-CU defense has finished no lower than fourth in the league in those categories.

In takeaways, the B-CU defense sat atop the league with + 18 in turnover margin. That comes on the heels of the team finishing atop the league in red zone defense. That was up a space from 2011 where they finished the season second in the league.

During the 2011 campaign, the Wildcats improved nationally to 14th in the NCAA FCS in pass defense, holding opponents to just 174.5 yards passing per game.

Sims aided Bethune-Cookman in reaching fourth in the final NCAA FCS rankings for pass efficiency defense (93.97) in 2010, in addition to ranking 25th nationally in pass defense (174.92 YPG). His defensive backs combined for 13 interceptions, making a big contribution to B-CU's number one ranking in the NCAA for turnover margin.

Before arriving in Daytona Beach, Sims spent four seasons as recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at Howard University. Prior to moving into the MEAC, Sims coached cornerbacks at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette for two seasons, working to improve passing coverage, and aiding the Ragin' Cajuns in attaining top-25 national pass defense rankings.

An experienced coach with ties to Texas and the Mid-Atlantic region, Sims previously served in the secondary at Prairie View A&M. While working with the Panthers, Sims coached the defensive backs, in addition to kick returners. He was also in charge of breaking down film and preparing opponent scouting reports. Additionally, he was active in the planning of recruiting weekends, organizing on-andoff campus recruiting, while serving the role of academic and compliance liaison.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University in Houston, also serving as the assistant head coach for three seasons and was recruiting and video coordinator.

During his four-year term with the Tigers, Sims coached some of the top defensive backs in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, including Santino Hall, who finished the 2001 season leading the conference in pass breakups with 20, and Oliver Celestin, who led TSU in interceptions and broke the school record for yards on an interception return. Both players went on to play professionally (Celestine: NY Jets, Hall: Saskatchewan Roughriders).

Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peav for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAffee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master's Degree from Louisville in 1997. A native of Jesup, Ga., Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra, and son Xavier.

- In his second game ever as a kick returner, SS Marquis Drayton logged five kickoff returns for 110 yards - including a 31-yarder after the weather delay.
- With Bethune-Cookman trailing 10-0 in the second quarter, a delay of over an hour - officially one hour and 14 minutes, stopped play due to inclement weather. The delay forced the third and fourth quarters to be just 10 minutes in length.
- Despite Quentin Williams getting the start, both Larry Brihm and Williams saw action under center. That marks the fifth consecutive season B-CU has used a two-quarterback system.

- Redshirt senior quarterback Quentin Williams passed for a careerbest 386 yards and four touchdowns, connecting on a career-high matching 20 completions out of an equally career-high tying 29 attempts. It was the fourth time Williams has thrown for 200 or more yards this season.
- · Having been held without a receiving touchdown the previous five weeks, redshirt sophomore receiver Frank Brown hauled in a pair of scoring strikes from quarterback Quentin Williams against Norfolk State. He now has eight receiving touchdowns in his career, including three multi-touchdown games.
