### STORY LINES

- Saturday's match-un between Bethune-Cookman and North Carolina A&T represents the third consecutive 2014 MEAC Co-Champion Bethune-Cookman is playing in as many weeks. B-CU defeated North Carolina Central and South Carolina State,
- This will be the first game between the Wildcats and Aggies since 2012, when B-CU took the game on a B-CU Homecoming weekend in torrential rain at Municipal Stadium.
- The 2011 trip to Aggie Stadium for Bethune-Cookman found the Cats with their lowest-scoring output of the Brian Jenkins era from 2010-14, with B-CU scoring just three (3) points in the loss.
- Bethune-Cookman has three fourth quarter come-from-behind wins this year at Grambling State, at North Carolina Central and versus South Carolina State, respectfully.
- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 42-15 in the month of October.

- 1. Redshirt senior quarterback Quentin Williams leads the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference in pass efficiency rating (158.95)
- 2. Graduate running back Anthony Jordan needs just one rushing score to take sole possession of fourth place on the all-time rushing touchdown list at B-CU.
- 3. This is the third consecutive co-champion from the 2014 MEAC season that Bethune-Cookman is playing during the "Murderer's Row" stretch.
- 4. Redshirt sophomore receiver Jawill Davis is second in the MEAC with 67.3 yards per game, having hauled in 404 yards on 18 receptions on the campaign.
- 5. The Wildcats are looking to go 4-0 in the MEAC for the second-straight time in the era of a first-year head coach.



### #LIGHTNINGSTRIKE

- . Bethune-Cookman head coach Terry Sims and Offensive Coordinator Jim Pry have continued the upbeat pace of the Wildcats offense.
- . Drives that consist of three minutes (3:00) or less are called "Lightning Strikes", with the quick pace of the offense striking fast like lightning.
- Of the 22 drives that B-CU has scored touchdowns on this season, 18 took less than three minutes off the clock. Seven of those drives lasted less than two minutes in length.

### **#OCTOBERFEST**

- · The month of October has been a scary month for the opposition throughout the last 15 years of B-CU
- · Since 2000. Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 42-14 in the Halloween month, including perfect marks in 2002 (3-0), 2010 (5-0), 2012 (3-0) and 2013 (4-0).
- Five of the 14 losses occurred away from home.

- . Bethune-Cookman has three active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the opening of the 2015 season.
- Ryan Davis (Jacksonville Jaguars), Rashean Mathis (Detroit Lions) and Eric Weems (Atlanta Falcons) are all participating for their respected teams.

- · Redshirt senior linebacker Robert Way leads the Wildcats with 40 tackles, and sits 18th overall in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference in that
- · Way is second on the Wildcats squad with four tackles behind the line of scrimmage, while leading the team with six pass breakups.
- · Against South Carolina State, Way registered a team-high 13 tackles (four primary stops) and a tackle for loss, adding a forced fumble.

#### SERIES NOTES...

- Bethune-Cookman leads the series against North Carolina A&T by a count of 22-14.
- Since 2000, B-CU holds a 9-4 advantage in the series, including a 5-2 mark in Greensboro, N.C.
- This will be the first meeting between the two teams since the Cats took a 28-12 victory over the Aggies on a 2012 Homecoming contest in Daytona Beach.
- The last trip to Greensboro for the Cats was their lowest scoring output in the MEAC under former head coach Brian Jenkins.

### HIGH FIVE FOR DAVIS...

 Redshirt sophomore WR Jawill Davis registered a game-high 199 receiving yards in the win at Grambling State on Sept. 12. That yardage placed him fifth all-time in the B-CU record books for single game receiving yards.

- The Bethune-Cookman Athletics family lost two former Wildcats this past week in the form of former equipment manager and teacher Art Parissi, as well as former punter Zach Adrian.
- Zach was apunter for the Wildcats from 1998-2001, where he averaged 35.7 yards a punt on 53 kicks.
- His father, Pete Adrian a former Bethune-Cookman defensive coordinator and Norfolk State University head coach, informed B-CU Athletics that Zach, after enduring over 300 chemotherapies, 32 radiation treatments and major surgeries on his hip and femur, passed peacefully while surrounded by family at Halifax Hospice of Volusia County.

### THAT'S THE WAY IT IS...

- · After B-CU defeated South Carolina State in an ESPNU Thursday night broadcast at Municipal Stadioum last Thursday, it was announced this week that redshirt senior LB Robert Way was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Week.
- Against South Carolina State, Robert Way sparked the Bethune-Cookman defense in yet another come-frombehind win for the Wildcats over the Bulldogs in a game televised on ESPNU in Thursday night football. Way supplied a team-high 13 tackles, four by way of primary stops, adding a tackle for loss. He also deflected a pass over the middle, and forced a fumble.



### LAST YEAR...

 B-CU went 9-3 in 2014 (6-2 MEAC), claiming a share of the school's third consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship. One of the biggest moments of the year was the season-opening victory at FIU, marking the second time in as many years the Wildcats registered a victory over an FBS opponent. B-CU ended the season with a victory over rival Florida A&M in the annual Florida Blue Florida Classic at the Orlando Citrus Bowl Stadium, giving the Cats their school-record fourth consecutive win over their conference foes from Tallahassee.

### 2015 SCHEDULE...

 Bethune-Cookman's 2015 football schedule, with five home games at Municipal Stadium aka "The Cage", features four nationally-televised contests. ### **HOME DOMINANCE**

 The Aggies were 4-1 at home last season, including a perfect 3-0 against MEAC schools. The Aggies are 21-3 at home since Broadway took over in 2011. They are 15-1 against conference schools since Broadway's arrival. A&T was just 5-21 at home over the five prior to Broadway's arrival.

· During the offseason the Aggies promoted wide receiver coach Chip Hester to offensive coordinator. Hester, who served as the head coach at Catawba College for seven seasons, replaced Rickey Bustle as the Aggies offensive coordinator. He will continue to coach wide receivers, in addition to his OC duties, Meanwhile. ●Defensive line coach Coutney Coard took a position at the University of Georgia.

### A QUICK STARTER

 Kwashaun Quick is 9-4 as the A&T starter. In 2013, he helped the Aggies top then Division I FCS power Appalachian State 24-21 in Boone. It was the first time in almost thirty years that an in-state school beat Appalachian State in Boone. In 2014, he made the opening-game start against Alabama A&M in a 47-13 drubbing of A&M in the MEAC/SWAC Challenge in Orlando, Florida.

- . The Aggies have 127 wins in their 44-year history in the MEAC. The third most among teams who have played in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- The Aggies have one Pro Football Hall of Famer in Elvin Bethea who was inducted into the hall in 2003. Bethea played defensive lineman for the Houston Oilers.
- Tarik Cohen has rushed for 2.488 vards over the first two years of his career. No Aggies has ever rushed for this many yards combined as a freshman and sophomore. Cohen's two-year performance is second all-time in A&T history. Here is a look at the best rushing performances in consecutive seasons in school history.
- Three receivers on N.C. A&T's roster participate in other sports on campus. After football season, Denzel Keyes goes immediately to the basketball court and plays for the A&T men's basketball team. Keyes has started six games as a men's basketball player. Caleb Gabriel is a sprint champion who won the MEAC championship in the 100 meters in May. Meanwhile Kevin Francis qualifi ed for NCAA regionals in the 100 meter hurdles.
- The Aggies defense has never finished lower than 16th nationally in the four years The run defense has never finished any lower than 24th in the nation.
- Marguis Ragland earned first-team All-MEAC honors last season and was a part of the preseason first-team defense for the MEAC. Ragland also blocked three kicks last season, which ranked him seventh in the nation. He also made 69 tackles and 15.5 tackles for loss from his nose guard position.
- Fifth-year middle linebacker Denzel Jones is the only returning starter among the linebacker corps from last season. Jones was third on the team in tackles a year ago and had two games where he finished with doubledigit tackles.

## **TERRY SIMS**

Head Coach, First Season Knoxville, 1994

Terry Sims was introduced as the 15th head coach at Bethune-Cookman University on December 22, 2015. The 43-year old native of Jesup, Georgia took over the program after spending the previous five years as an assistant coach for the Wildcats. While the 2015 season will be his first as head coach, it will be his sixth year overall with the Maroon and Gold of Bethune-Cookman.

Sims is recognized nationally by several collegiate and professional coaches as "a head coach that is just now getting his program", after being viewed as head coach material for quite some time - though continuing to serve as an assistant. His football knowledge and defensive prowess is unparalleled, and viewed by many as secondto-none. Since his arrival in Daytona Beach back in 2010, the Wildcats defense has consistently ranked in the top 25 statistically in several categories.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position with the Maroon and Gold, Sims served as assistant head coach. He oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the B-CU program, as well as working ext5ensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick

In 2014, B-CU once again captured no less than a share of the school's seventh MEAC crown all-time, as well as the fourth title in the last five seasons. Once again, the defensive side of the ball was a huge part of that success, as they finished in the top three of several categories in the league, as well as nationally.

The defensive unit finished atop the FCS for total defense and rush defense. The Cats allowed just 237.5 yards per game to their opposition, while also allowing just 79.9 yards per game on the ground. The team would go on to finish second in the FCS for first downs defense, and seventh nationally in passing yards allowed (157.6 p/g).

During the 2013 campaign, the B-CU secondary once again caused havoc amongst opposing offenses around the MEAC and nation alike. In all, 14 of the team's 19 interceptions were recorded by the secondary, including a team-high five by safety Nick Addison. The unit finished third in the MEAC for pass defense, allowing just 149.2 yards per game through the air. The Wildcats finished second in the league for interceptions, grabbing 19 and returning three for scores. That number allowed them to finish tied for fifth nationally for passes intercepted, and on the third-fewest passes attempted (326) among the top 20 team for that category.

In 2012, the Wildcats stood as the third-best team in the nation for passes intercepted, bringing down 20 on the campaign. They also improved a spot from 12th in passing defense in 2011, up to 11th in 2012. The Cats' 20 interceptions also ranked as the most for any team sitting in the top 25 for passing defense overall. In passing efficiency defense, the Wildcats were second in the nation. For scoring defense, Bethune-Cookman not only finished second in the MEAC, but 10th nationally.

In capturing their second MEAC crown in three years, the Wildcats defense helped limit the opposition all season long in 2012. As a unit, the Cats finished second in scoring defense in the league, in addition to third in total defense. Since his arrival, the B-CU defense has finished no lower than fourth in the league in those categories.

In takeaways, the B-CU defense sat atop the league with + 18 in turnover margin. That comes on the heels of the team finishing atop the league in red zone defense. That was up a space from 2011 where they finished the season second in the league.

During the 2011 campaign, the Wildcats improved nationally to 14th in the NCAA FCS in pass defense, holding opponents to just 174.5 yards passing per game.

Sims aided Bethune-Cookman in reaching fourth in the final NCAA FCS rankings for pass efficiency defense (93.97) in 2010, in addition to ranking 25th nationally in pass defense (174.92 YPG). His defensive backs combined for 13 interceptions, making a big contribution to B-CU's number one ranking in the NCAA for turnover margin.

Before arriving in Daytona Beach, Sims spent four seasons as recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at Howard University. Prior to moving into the MEAC, Sims coached cornerbacks at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette for two seasons, working to improve passing coverage, and aiding the Ragin' Cajuns in attaining top-25 national pass defense rankings.

An experienced coach with ties to Texas and the Mid-Atlantic region, Sims previously served in the secondary at Prairie View A&M. While working with the Panthers, Sims coached the defensive backs, in addition to kick returners. He was also in charge of breaking down film and preparing opponent scouting reports. Additionally, he was active in the planning of recruiting weekends, organizing on-andoff campus recruiting, while serving the role of academic and compliance liaison.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University in Houston, also serving as the assistant head coach for three seasons and was recruiting and video coordinator.

During his four-year term with the Tigers, Sims coached some of the top defensive backs in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, including Santino Hall, who finished the 2001 season leading the conference in pass breakups with 20, and Oliver Celestin, who led TSU in interceptions and broke the school record for yards on an interception return. Both players went on to play professionally (Celestine: NY Jets, Hall: Saskatchewan Roughriders).

Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peav for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAffee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master's Degree from Louisville in 1997. A native of Jesup, Ga., Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra, and son Xavier.

#### **GAME NOTES**

- The 45-0 loss tonight marks the first shutout loss for the Wildcats in a span of 94 games, dating back to Nov. 11, 2006.
- The loss for Bethune-Cookman marks the fourth of its kind against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent. B-CU is 0-3 against Miami, and 0-1 against Florida State.

#### **GAME NOTES**

- For the second consecutive game, the Bethune-Cookman defense failed to allow an offensive touchdown from the opposition. The only touchdown allowed came off an interception in the end zone by the Savannah State defense.
- The B-CU defense allowed just 91 yards rushing, marking the first time this season the defense held an opponent under 100 yards rushing in a contest. It is also the second consecutive game the defense has not allowed a rushing touchdown.
- Cornerback Jocelyn Borgella, Jr. logged his second career interception in the victory over Savannah State. In fact, both of the walk-ons' interceptions have come against Savannah State, with the last being a pick in 2013 at home against the Tigers in the friendly confines of Municipal Stadium.
- Redshirt senior quarterback Quentin Williams passed for a game-high 207 yards (just under a career-high of 22 from a season ago), and rushed for 100 yards. He became the first quarterback to pass for at least 200 yards and rush for at least 100 in a game since Jimmie Russell in 2004 (vs. FAMU - 325 passing / 101 rushing). Williams also tied a career-high with two passing touchdowns.
