STORY LINES

- Bethune-Cookman enters the weekend having lost its last five games on the spin the longest losing streak for the Wildcats since dropping seven consecutive in 1996.
- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 44-17 in the month of October.
- Bethune-Cookman is 0-5 to start the year for the first time since 1993, when the Wildcats began the year with nine
 consecutive defeats under head coach Sylvester Collins.
- This marks the second consecutive game on television for the Wildcats, having played on ESPN3/ESPNU last weekend at home against North Carolina A&T. It is also the third consecutive television game against the Spartans in Norfolk, Virginia.
- Bethune-Cookman has won the last two games against the Spartans, as well as back-to-back in Norfolk.
- Though holding a record of 0-5, this weekend's game was originally slated to be the eighth game of the year. B-CU's game
 against Alcorn was canceled due to weather, while the S.C. State game was postponed for the same reason.

- 1. Bethune-Cookman will be seeking its first win of the season - looking to snap a five-game losing skid which is the longest of its kind since 1996.
- 2. This is just the second game in the last four meetings that neither team is ranked in the FCS polls.
- 3. Bethune-Cookman sits seventh nationally in punt returns, averaging 19.30 yards per return on the year.
- 4. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Larry Brihm, Jr. tossed a career-best four touchdown passes last weekend against North Carolina A&T.
- 5. Bethune-Cookman had five receivers pull in multiple receptions last weekend against the Aggies of North Carolina A&T.



#LightningStrike

- Bethune-Cookman head coach Terry Sims and Offensive Coordinator Jim Pry have continued the upbeat pace of the Wildcats offense.
- . Drives that consist of three minutes (3:00) or less are called "Lightning Strikes", with the quick pace of the offense striking fast like lightning.
- This season, Bethune-Cookman scoring drives have averaged just 2:12 off the clock, while touchdown drives are averaging just 1:21 overall.

#OCTOBERFEST

- The month of October has been a scary month for the opposition throughout the last 16 years of B-CU Football.
- · Since 2000. Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 44-17 in the Halloween month, including perfect marks in 2002 (3-0), 2010 (5-0), 2012 (3-0) and 2013 (4-0).
- Only six of the 17 losses occurred away from home.



#PROCATS

- Bethune-Cookman has two active #ProCats in the National Football League on active rosters for the 2016 season.
- . Ryan Davis (Dallas Cowboys) and Eric Weems (Atlanta Falcons) are both participating for their respected teams.
- Nick Collins (Green Bay Packers) and Rashean Mathis (Jacksonville Jaguars) both announced their retirement from the NFL prior to the beginning of the season.
- Both Collins and Mathis were inducted into the Bethune-Cookman Athletics Hall of Fame last weekend in Daytona Beach.

- · Wide receiver Frank Brown leads all Bethune-Cookman wide-outs with a team-matching 17 receptions for 319 yards and five touchdowns.

- · Against N.C. A&T, Brown hauled in a career-high three touchdown passes from redshirt junior quarterback Larry Brihm, Jr.

A WIN OVER NORFOLK STATE WOULD...

- Give Bethune-Cookman its first win of the 2016 campaign.
- Extend B-CU's winning streak over the Spartans to three games.
- Give the Wildcats their 13th win overall all-time in the Hampton Roads area of Virginia.
- Allow Wildcats' head coach Terry Sims to collect his 10th victory in charge of the Maroon and Gold.

SERIES NOTES...

- Bethune-Cookman leads the all-time series against Norfolk State, 18-8.
- . This will be just the second meeting between the Wildcats and Spartans without a former B-CU coaching staff member on the Green and Gold sideline since 2004.
- Bethune-Cookman has played Norfolk State on television in Norfolk the last two meetings.
- This will be just the second game in the last four meetings that neither team is ranked in either of the FCS polls.

RIGHT TO THE BRIHM...

- Redshirt junior quarterback Larry Brihm, Jr. registered a career-high game in a tough loss to North Carolina A&T a week ago in Daytona Beach.
- Brihm connected on a career-high 23-of-42 passes; accounting for a career-best 376 yards; and tossing a career-best four touchdown passes. Three of those passes went to classmate Frank Brown who had a careerbest with three receiving touchdowns.
- Although playing at 85 percent and recovering from injury, Brihm came off the bench to spark the Wildcats in place of starter redshirt freshman Akevious Williams.

AGAINST THE RANKINGS...

• The loss to No. 15 North Carolina A&T marked the third consecutive loss for the Wildcats against ranked teams. However, one of those teams was No. 8 (FBS) Florida State – eventually winning the national championship in 2013 with Heisman Trophy winner Jameis Winston.

DELAYED, POSTPONED AND CANCELED...

- · With the MEAC/SWAC Challenge delayed by almost three hours and eventually suspended altogether, and the North Carolina Central game delayed for just under three hours, the Wildcats have experienced more delays than any team in the FCS this season in terms of length of time.
- Bethune-Cookman has had one game suspended and two postponed to later dates this year, all due to weather.

B-CU AND S.C. STATE GAME MOVED...

. Due to Hurricane Matthew hitting the east coast, the game between Bethune-Cookman and South Carolina State has been moved to Saturday, November 26.

THE INJURY BUG...

- · According to Head Coach Terry Sims, he has never has a season in which injuries have struck a team he coached in history.
- In all, a total of 12 original starters from the beginning of the season have missed time due mto injury, including two season-ending injuries in the form of running back Michael Jones and junior quarterback Anthony Cruz. Both players are expected to petition for and receive a medical hardship waiver following the season.
- Cruz suffered a fractured wrist in the first half of a game at Savannah State easrlier this year.

 B-CU went 9-2 in 2015 (7-1 MEAC), claiming a share of the school's fourth consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship. - Bethune-Cookman, while the 59 points was just shy of a record 61 points scored back in 1961. The win also gave the Cats their sixth consecutive Homecoming victory.
- Redshirt senior quarterback Quentin Williams passed for a career-best 386 yards and four touchdowns, connecting on a career-high matching 20 completions out of an equally career-high tying 29 attempts. It was the fourth time Williams has thrown for 200 or more yards this season.
- In passing for 386 yards, Quentin Williams became the first B-CU signal-caller to register at least 300 yards passing in a game since Jarod Rucker (367) against South Carolina in 2006, as part of the Low Country Classic played in Charleston, South Carolina at The Citadel. Additionally, Williams became the first player to collect 400 yards of total offense - adding 39 yards on the ground rushing, since Jimmie Russell (426 yards) in the 2004 Walt Disney World Florida Classic back in 2004 against Florida A&M.
- · Wide receiver Frank Brown (102) and running back Michael D. Jones (112) became the first duo to claim at least 100 yards receiving in a game since 2006, when Stephon Walker (123) and Paul Neufville (112) accomplished the task against South Carolina State in Charleston, South Carolina.
- Graduate running back Anthony Jordan scampered in from three yards out to begin the scoring frenzy for the Wildcats in the first quarter. The touchdown gave the Atlanta native his 32nd career rushing score, and put him in sole possession of fourth place all-time on the B-CU list for career rushing touchdowns. In the process, he broke a tie with Pa'Tell Troutman, as Jordan now owns 32 rushing scores in his career.

CONFERENCE MISSES...

. Bethune-Cookman's two conference "misses" in 2016 are Hampton and Howard. This marks the second year in a row that Hampton and Howard are off the schedule, while the Cats picked up Morgan State and Delaware State in 2015.

NOTES FROM THE OPPONENT: NORFOLK STATE

BIG THINGS COME IN SMALL PACKAGES

 Sophomore WR Marcus Taylor, the fastest player on NSU's team, has emerged as one of the Spartans' top threats with the ball in his hands. Taylor recorded career highs of eight receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown against North Carolina Central. He followed that up with four catches for 78 yards and another TD, covering 64 yards, against Howard the following week before finishing with five catches at North Carolina A&T. With 21, he has already matched his reception total from last season.

TEAM DEFENSIVE EFFORT

• LB Kyle Archie posted a team-high 12 total tackles at North Carolina A&T, marking the first time this season a player has led the Spartans in tackles in more than one game. Archie also had a team best 11 against Howard. Other game by game leaders include FS Bobby Price (eight vs. Elizabeth City State), CB Sandy Chapman (10 vs. Richmond), DB Donte' Haynesworth and LB Damiyan Caldwell (eight apiece vs. William & Mary), and LB T.C. Livingston (15 vs. NCCU)

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

 For the fourth time in six games this season, the Spartans forced more turnovers than they committed in the contest with North Carolina A&T. That continues a trend for the Spartans under coach Latrell Scott. Last season, NSU committed more turnovers than its opponent just once all season. Against N.C. A&T, Sandy Chapman recovered a fumble punt and T.C. Livingston snared his first career interceptions, while the Spartans did not commit any turnovers.

- . NSU enters the game on a five-game losing streak, its longest since a seven-game slide in 2012. The Spartans had a bye week last Saturday following a 35-0 loss at No. 18 North Carolina A&T on Thursday, Oct. 6.
- Senior kicker Cameron Marouf is moving up the school's Division I records list for field goals made. The preseason All-MEAC second-team kicker – who also earned third-team All-MEAC postseason honors as a sophomore in 2014 – tied his career high with three field goals against NCCU, giving him 30 for his career.
- QB Greg Hankerson Jr. was named to the watch list for the inaugural Deacon Jones Trophy. The award will be given by the Black College Football Hall of Fame to the black college player of the year in February in Atlanta, Hankerson is one of 52 HBCU players from the Division I and Division II ranks on the initial list.
- . The HBCU web site From the Press Box to Press Row (www.boxtorow.com) ranked the Norfolk State football recruiting class as the best in the MEAC and third among all HBCUs in its February release. The article cited NSU's heavy dose of Hampton Roads recruits and also noted the presence of a strong offensive line class – the Spartans have a total of eight true freshmen linemen, three of whom were rated as two or three stars by Rivals or ESPN.
- NSU has been known to have successful brother tandems on the gridiron and this year the Spartans have another set of siblings in brothers George and J.T. Wahee. George is a redshirt freshman receiver who is slated to start. He redshirted last season after signing with NSU out of private school Bishop Sullivan Catholic High in 2015, where he was an all-state receiver and returner.

TERRY SIMS

Head Coach, Second Season Knoxville, 1994

After one year at the helm in Daytona Beach, Terry Sims continued the positive success enjoyed by Bethune-Cookman with the school's fourth consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title. He led the Wildcats to a 9-2 record in his first season and a 7-1 mark, including a share of the MEAC title.

Sims, 44, has been a part of B-CU's unprecedented run of five conference titles in six years for the Maroon and Gold, joining the staff in 2010. While 2015 marked his first year as head coach of the Wildcats, it was his sixth season overall with the

Under his guise in 2015, Sims was named MEAC Coach of the Year after matching South Carolina State (1980-83) for the second-longest streak in MEAC history with the current run of four MEAAC crowns on the spin.

B-CU led the MEAC in several statistical categories, including scoring offense (31.4 avg/g), total offense (445.0 avg/g), rushing offense (191.8 yds./g), pass offense (253.2 avg/g), and pass efficiency (164.1 efficiency). The Cats also hold top 10 positions in the FCS in passing yards per completion (6th) and team passing efficiency (3rd). B-CU entered the STATS FCS Top 25 poll in the final ranking of the season (25th) and have slowly climbed the FCS Coaches Poll to reach No. 21 following the last game of the regular season.

He had a total of 10 student-athletes named to the All-MEAC first, second and third team, respectfully. The list includes quarterback Quentin Williams, wide receiver Jawill Davis, offensive lineman Dariusz Bladek, linebacker Robert Way and defensive back Marguis Drayton - all named first team members.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position with the Maroon and Gold, Sims served as assistant head coach. He oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the B-CU program, as well as working ext5ensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of MEAC all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick Addison.

In 2014, the defensive unit finished atop the FCS for total defense and rush defense. The Cats allowed just 237.5 yards per game to their opposition, while also allowing just 79.9 yards per game on the ground. The team would go on to finish second in the FCS for first downs defense, and seventh nationally in passing yards allowed (157.6 p/g).

During the 2013 campaign, the B-CU secondary once again caused havoc amongst opposing offenses around the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference and nation alike. In all, 14 of the team's 19 interceptions were recorded by the secondary, including a teamhigh five by safety Nick Addison. The unit finished third in the MEAC for pass defense, allowing just 149.2 yards per game through the air. The Wildcats finished second in the league for interceptions, grabbing 19 and returning three for scores. That number allowed them to finish tied for fifth nationally for passes intercepted, and on the thirdfewest passes attempted (326) among the top 20 team for that category.

In 2012, the Wildcats stood as the third-best team in the nation for passes intercepted, bringing down 20 on the campaign. They also improved a spot from 12th in passing defense in 2011, up to 11th in 2012. The Cats' 20 interceptions also ranked as the most for any team sitting in the top 25 for passing defense overall. In passing efficiency defense, the Wildcats were second in the nation, sitting just .37 behind frontrunner North Carolina A&T. For scoring defense, Bethune-Cookman not only finished second in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), but also 10th in the nation.

During the 2011 campaign, the Wildcats improved nationally to 14th in the NCAA FCS in pass defense, holding opponents to just 174.5 yards passing per game. Safety Jean Fanor collected three picks and 74 tackles in 2011, going on to join the Kansas City Chiefs as a free agent.

Sims aided Bethune-Cookman in reaching fourth in the final NCAA FCS rankings for pass efficiency defense (93.97) in 2010, in addition to ranking 25th nationally in pass defense (174.92 YPG). His defensive backs combined for 13 interceptions, making a big contribution to B-CU's number one ranking in the NCAA for turnover margin (+2.25). On his watch, safety Michael Williams snagged six picks to finish fourth in the FCS on the year for interceptions.

Before arriving in Daytona Beach, Sims spent four seasons in the Nation's Capital of Washington, D.C., serving as recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at Howard University. Prior to moving into the MEAC, Sims coached cornerbacks at the University of Louisiana at Lafavette for two seasons, working to improve passing coverage, and aiding the Ragin' Cajuns in attaining top-25 national pass defense rankings.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University in Houston, also serving as the assistant head coach for three seasons and was recruiting and video coordinator.

During his four-year term with the Tigers, Sims coached some of the top defensive backs in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, including Santino Hall, who finished the 2001 season leading the conference in pass breakups with 20, and Oliver Celestin, who led TSU in interceptions and broke the school record for yards on an interception return. Both players went on to play professionally (Celestine: NY Jets, Hall: Saskatchewan Roughriders).

Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peav for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAffee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master's Degree from Louisville in 1997. A native of Jesup, Ga., Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra, and son Xavier.
