## STORY LINES

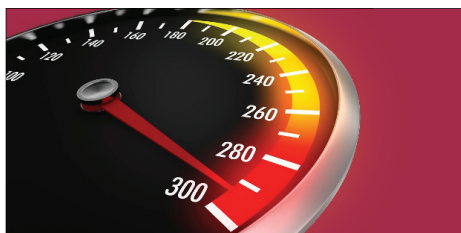
- This will be the second time in the last five years that Bethune-Cookman is taking on Tennessee State. It is also the second time in as many home games against the Tigers that B-CU is taking on TSU as part of a *Hall of Fame* weekend in Daytona Beach.
- In 2012 and 2013, respectfully, Bethune-Cookman and Tennessee State split a pair of home games, with the visiting team holding serve in each contest.
- With the season opener against Alcorn State suspended in the second quarter on Labor Day weekend, this is technically Bethune-Cookman's home opener for the 2016 season.
- Bethune-Cookman has never defeated the Tigers away from Nashville.
- With it being Hall of Fame weekend, the Wildcats honored 13 former coaches and student-athletes into the athletics hall of fame last night at an induction ceremony.

## #5THINGS

1. Bethune-Cookman will be seeking its first ever win against Tennessee State away from the city of Nashville.
2. This is just the second game ever played between the Tigers and Wildcats in the city of Daytona Beach.
3. The Cats have won three consecutive home opening contests dating back to 2013. The last home opening loss came against TSU in 2012.
4. Redshirt junior quarterback Larry Brihm, Jr. is preparing to make just his fourth collegiate start under center for the Maroon and Gold.
5. This is the latest home opening game for the Cats since opening at home against Tennessee State on sept. 22, 2012.



### #LightningStrike

- Bethune-Cookman head coach Terry Sims and Offensive Coordinator Jim Pry have continued the upbeat pace of the Wildcats offense.
- Drives that consist of three minutes (3:00) or less are called "Lightning Strikes", with the quick pace of the offense striking fast like lightning.
- This season in just one game, the Cats struck with an 87-yard drive in less than two minutes a week ago at North Texas.

### #SEPTEMBER

- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman holds a record of 45-18 in the month of September.
- In the 18 losses in the month of September, six (6) have come at the hands of FBS opponent Miami (3x), UCF, Florida State and North Texas, respectively.
- The Wildcats last FCS loss in the month of September came at the hands of TSU in 2012.

### #BCYouChoose

- Fans were allowed to choose the jersey combination for the Wildcats in the first week versus Alcorn State.
- The winner was a combination of Maroon shirts, Maroon pants and the Maroon Wildcats helmet, but the pants were switched to Gold due to delays in shipping.
- Fans chose between four different combinations including: All Maroon (helmet, jersey and pants); Maroon jersey/Gold pants; All Gold (helmet, jersey and pants); and Gold jersey/Black pants.
- During the voting process, Bethune-Cookman Athletics used the hashtag #BCYouChoose for fans to join the conversation and help the Cats choose a jersey for the season opener.

- Senior receiver Jontavious Carter hauled in a catch for eight yards last week at North Texas.
- Carter transferred to Bethune-Cookman from the University of Miami in 2013. He took a medical hardship waiver in 2014, after suffering an upper extremity injury prior to the beginning of the campaign.
- Last season, Carter bounced back for the Wildcats as a go-to receiver in clutch situations.

## A WIN OVER TENNESSEE STATE WOULD...

- Extend Bethune-Cookman's home winning streak to 12 games.
- Give Bethune-Cookman consecutive wins over the Tigers for the first time in series history.
- Give Head Coach Terry Sims the second home opening win of his career.
- Allow B-CU a win over the Tigers at Municipal Stadium for the first time in the history of the series.

## SERIES NOTES...

- This is just the second time in the history of the series that Bethune-Cookman is playing host to Tennessee State in Daytona Beach.
- Tennessee State holds a 6-2 edge in the history of a series that dates back to 1982.
- Before the Cats took a 16-13 decision over the Tigers in 1987, TSU had won the previous five contests in the series.

## HIGH FIVE FOR DAVIS...

- Redshirt sophomore WR Jawill Davis registered a game-high 199 receiving yards last season in an away victory at Grambling State. That yardage placed him fifth all-time in the B-CU record books for single game receiving yards.

## NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS...

- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman is 35-12 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State, FIU (2x) and Tennessee State, respectfully.
- Of the 12 losses in non-conference play, six have come against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), including Florida State, Miami (3x), North Texas and UCF.

## SIMS CITY

- With nine (9) wins during his inaugural season at the helm of the Bethune-Cookman football program, head coach Terry Sims matched former head coach Wesley Moore with the second-most wins in a first season as head coach of the Maroon and Gold.
- Only head coaches Rudolph "Bunky" Matthews (1947) and Brian Jenkins (2010) had more wins, with each collecting 10 during their debut campaign. However, both of those seasons contained 12-game slates, as opposed to just 11 for Sims and Moore, respectfully.

## LAST YEAR...

- B-CU went 9-2 in 2015 (7-1 MEAC), claiming a share of the school's fourth consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship. Throughout the year, Bethune-Cookman registered quality wins on the road at

- P **Jonathan Cagle**, WR **Jawill Davis**, OL **Trevin Huff**, RB **Michael D. Jones**, TE **Ja-Quan Lumas**, DB **Diquan Richardson** and DL **Kevin Thompson** were each selected to the first team.
- Joining the Wildcats on the second team offense was OL **Phillip Norman**, while teammates DL **Todney Evans** and DL **DeMarcus Womack** were voted to the second team defense.

- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman has a record of 13-3 in season opening contests. That includes a 4-1 mark in season-opening home openers inside Municipal Stadium.

**2016 SCHEDULE...**

- Bethune-Cookman's 2016 football schedule, with five home games at Municipal Stadium aka "The Cage", features four nationally-televised contests. The slate also sees a season-opener against Alcorn State in the MEAC/SWAC Challenge held in Daytona Beach for the first time, before traveling to FBS opponent North Texas. The following weekend, B-CU returns home for the first of a two-year agreement with Tennessee State (Sept. 17) which serves as *Hall of Fame Weekend*, with B-CU returning to the road the following weekend for the MEAC opener against Savannah State (Sept. 24). B-CU then begins "Murderers Row" with a visit from North Carolina Central (Oct. 1), traveling to South Carolina State (Oct. 8) and a Thursday night contest against North Carolina A&T (Oct. 13) at Municipal Stadium. - The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference begins its 47th year of intercollegiate competition heading into the 2016-17 academic school year. Located in Norfolk, Va., the MEAC is made up of 13 outstanding historically black institutions across the Atlantic coastline
- On June 8, 1980, the MEAC was classified as a Division I conference by the NCAA. Prior to that year, the

conference operated as a Division II conference. The month after it achieved Division I status, the MEAC received an automatic qualification to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship.

**PLAYOFFS???**

- Despite the introduction of the Celebration Bowl in February 2015, a member of the MEAC still has the possibility of participating in the FCS Playoffs. A member would have to accept an at-large bid to the playoffs, which last happened with South Carolina State accepting the at-large bid in 2013.
- That same year, 12th-ranked Bethune-Cookman earned the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs before falling at No. 11 Coastal Carolina in the opening round.

**LAST TIME BETWEEN B-CU AND TSU...**

- Bethune-Cookman claimed a hard-fought 12-9 decision over the Tigers of Tennessee State as part of the annual John Merritt Classic in Nashville in 2013.
- Tight end Jordan Murphy's go-ahead, game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter erased a 9-6 deficit for the Cats.
- Bethune-Cookman withstood a late field goal attempt by the Tigers as Jamin Godfrey's 49-yard attempt was just short in an attempt to send the game to overtime as time expired.

**CONFERENCE MISSES...**

- Bethune-Cookman's two conference "misses" in 2016 are Hampton and Howard. This marks the second year in a row that Hampton and Howard are off the schedule, while the Cats picked up Morgan State and Delaware State in 2015.

## TERRY SIMS

**Head Coach, Second Season  
Knoxville, 1994**

After one year at the helm in Daytona Beach, Terry Sims continued the positive success enjoyed by Bethune-Cookman with the school's fourth consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title. He led the Wildcats to a 9-2 record in his first season and a 7-1 mark, including a share of the MEAC title.

Sims, 44, has been a part of B-CU's unprecedented run of five conference titles in six years for the Maroon and Gold, joining the staff in 2010. While 2015 marked his first year as head coach of the Wildcats, it was his sixth season overall with the program.

Under his guise in 2015, Sims was named MEAC Coach of the Year after matching South Carolina State (1980-83) for the second-longest streak in MEAC history with the current run of four MEAC crowns on the spin.

B-CU led the MEAC in several statistical categories, including scoring offense (31.4 avg/g), total offense (445.0 avg/g), rushing offense (191.8 yds./g), pass offense (253.2 avg/g), and pass efficiency (164.1 efficiency). The Cats also hold top 10 positions in the FCS in passing yards per completion (6th) and team passing efficiency (3rd). B-CU entered the STATS FCS Top 25 poll in the final ranking of the season (25th) and have slowly climbed the FCS Coaches Poll to reach No. 21 following the last game of the regular season.

He had a total of 10 student-athletes named to the All-MEAC first, second and third team, respectfully. The list includes quarterback Quentin Williams, wide receiver Jawill Davis, offensive lineman Dariusz Bladek, linebacker Robert Way and defensive back Marquis Drayton – all named first team members.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position with the Maroon and Gold, Sims served as assistant head coach. He oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the B-CU program, as well as working extensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of MEAC all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick Addison.

In 2014, the defensive unit finished atop the FCS for total defense and rush defense. The Cats allowed just 237.5 yards per game to their opposition, while also allowing just 79.9 yards per game on the ground. The team would go on to finish second in the FCS for first downs defense, and seventh nationally in passing yards allowed (157.6 p/g).

During the 2013 campaign, the B-CU secondary once again caused havoc amongst opposing offenses around the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference and nation alike. In all, 14 of the team's 19 interceptions were recorded by the secondary, including a team-high five by safety Nick Addison. The unit finished third in the MEAC for pass defense, allowing just 149.2 yards per game through the air. The Wildcats finished second in the league for interceptions, grabbing 19 and returning three for scores. That number allowed them to finish tied for fifth nationally for passes intercepted, and on the third-fewest passes attempted (326) among the top 20 team for that category.

In 2012, the Wildcats stood as the third-best team in the nation for passes intercepted, bringing down 20 on the campaign. They also improved a spot from 12th in passing defense in 2011, up to 11th in 2012. The Cats' 20 interceptions also ranked as the most for any team sitting in the top 25 for passing defense overall. In passing efficiency defense, the Wildcats were second in the nation, sitting just .37 behind frontrunner North Carolina A&T. For scoring defense, Bethune-Cookman not only finished second in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), but also 10th in the nation.

During the 2011 campaign, the Wildcats improved nationally to 14th in the NCAA FCS in pass defense, holding opponents to just 174.5 yards passing per game. Safety Jean Fanor collected three picks and 74 tackles in 2011, going on to join the Kansas City Chiefs as a free agent.

Sims aided Bethune-Cookman in reaching fourth in the final NCAA FCS rankings for pass efficiency defense (93.97) in 2010, in addition to ranking 25th nationally in pass defense (174.92 YPG). His defensive backs combined for 13 interceptions, making a big contribution to B-CU's number one ranking in the NCAA for turnover margin (+2.25). On his watch, safety Michael Williams snagged six picks to finish fourth in the FCS on the year for interceptions.

Before arriving in Daytona Beach, Sims spent four seasons in the Nation's Capital of Washington, D.C., serving as recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at Howard University. Prior to moving into the MEAC, Sims coached cornerbacks at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette for two seasons, working to improve passing coverage, and aiding the Ragin' Cajuns in attaining top-25 national pass defense rankings.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University in Houston, also serving as the assistant head coach for three seasons and was recruiting and video coordinator.

During his four-year term with the Tigers, Sims coached some of the top defensive backs in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, including Santino Hall, who finished the 2001 season leading the conference in pass breakups with 20, and Oliver Celestine, who led TSU in interceptions and broke the school record for yards on an interception return. Both players went on to play professionally (Celestine: NY Jets, Hall: Saskatchewan Roughriders).

Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peay for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAfee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master's Degree from Louisville in 1997. A native of Jesup, Ga., Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra, and son Xavier.
